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In recent days, and for many months to come, there has been and will be a new debate involving the Virginia state battle flag of the Confederacy. Most recently the one that is attached to a Confederate Memorial and is protected under law in the capital of South Carolina. I would like to point out what we call the Confederate flag today was not the symbol for all southern states during the Civil War, but has somehow come to represent all of them during that time in our Nation's history. This particular flag was the one most flown on the battlefields in the state of Virginia, which so happens was the state that saw the most battles during the Civil War. This flag has also come to represent Racism, Oppression, Hatred, among other things. The only things this flag could possibly represent and should represent in its truest form is heritage and history.

I know many people will see that one sentence and automatically write off what I am going to say. Those same individuals who do not see this to the end are the ones who are ignorant to history and ignorant to change. These same individuals will be the first ones to cry foul, but always the last to actually do anything about it. If you want change then you must make things change. This statement rings true for any cause, any religious affiliation or lack thereof, any war, any way of life, anything!!! To make things change we must learn from the victories and the mistakes of the past. To do this, we must accept the past, teach it and teach how things can and should be different. Only then can we truly move on knowing that we, as a nation, are not doomed to fail and repeat those very same mistakes.

To start things off in the proper sense I guess, is to tell a brief and very short history. Before the Civil

War, many people of the South felt OPRESSED by Northern aggressions. In the easiest way to put it, the North wanted more than the South could produce and it came at a greater cost to the South. For this very reason the South was left to pay a Northern tax without proper representation in Congress. Just like the Colonies felt towards England leading up to the Revolution. Things came to a head when California was introduced into Statehood without the consent and acknowledgement of the laws set forth regarding "free" and slave states. Tensions boiled over until the election of 1860 when Abraham Lincoln was elected president. From then on until the start of the war in SC in 1861. Part of this Northern aggression was the demand for cotton and tobacco products. Without the cotton from the South, Northern textile mills could not function and could not produce money or jobs for the more populated region of our Nation at the time. Many of the congressman from the North were attached to these mills. To keep up with production many plantation owners had slaves. Even then, slaves were not enough to keep up with production demands and this led to the invention of the cotton gin by Eli Whitney. The cost to own and operate the machine was more than owning slaves. A rather unfortunate event, but one that happened anyways. During this time slaves were still owned and used in the North, but given a different name and could be any race of person. These people would still be known as Indentured Servants to this day and is still completely legal.

The South had seen enough of this "aggression" and decided it was time for individual states to have more power governing its people within its borders over a Federal centralized government, better known as, states rights. So, with this in mind, the Southern states started to secede from the Union. Only 11 of the "slave states" would secede from the Union. Many men and women from the South were willing to give up everything they had including their lives. It didn't matter if they were rich or they were poor. What mattered to them was the ability to live a life that they had wanted and had come accustomed to. To many Northerners, past and present, believe that this was all about Slavery. To many it was about Slavery. The rich Southern plantation owners needed the cheap labor to stay rich and to look important. The more slaves you had the wealthier the man. The wealthier the man the more power he had. To many of the poor southern farmers this was about "life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness."

Slaves had been an essential part of the lives for the Nation until the industrial age started. I personally didn't agree with slavery and still don't, but it has been something that is still not lost. So clearly, people of the world have not learned any lessons. Slavery is not here in the US, but in many nations it's still common place. Slavery was not a racist endeavor. Slaves from all periods of time were all different types of races. During the Roman Empire most slaves were in fact white. Those particular people were a different religion or class. If you were poor and had too much debt you could be put into slavery to pay off such debts. Which we all know didn't happen. Once a slave always a slave. Ancient Egypt used the Jewish community as slaves to build the great pyramids. At least that is what we are taught and what the bible tells us. People are still kidnapped and sold into slavery every day and many from right here in the US. It doesn't matter what race you are as long as you can bring in the money.

No one ever mentions it was the northern states merchant ships that brought the south the slaves. No one ever mentions how the north benefited from the slave market. Do we just assume the south was rich enough to do everything on their own with less population and control? No one ever mentions how no slave ship or government office or anything had the rebel flag flying during the time of slavery. No one ever mentions how only about 30% of people feel "offended" by the rebel flag, but now in the midst of tragedy people make it seem so much worse. No one mentions how actual hate groups like the KKK detest people who commit awful hate crimes like the Charleston shootings. No one ever mentions how the flag was traditionally used for the confederacy until the 1940s when it took on new roles. During this time many "patriot" groups used the flag to symbolize their hatred for the federal government and to the black community. It would eventually take a darker turn in the 50s and 60s to be about segregationism. People assume the rebel flag is the official symbol of the KKK

and other white supremacy groups and it's not true. Some ignorant people do choose to use it, but that's due to lack of education.

Back to the point of the flag. The Confederate flag is a symbol. A symbol that no one should be paying respects to. This flag is a symbol of a forgotten era and a forgotten time and a forgotten war. This flag should not be treated like the American flag or states flags. As such, this flag should not be flying higher than other official flags. This flag, in my opinion should still fly where it is historically accurate. In this particular case it's on a confederate memorial. These memorials are symbols and reminders of the past. Yes a "failed" rebellion, but a rebellion that made this Nation better. Had it not been for that we may not be any different today. This flag was not about racism as many have turned it into. Just like the swastika was not a racist symbol until the Nazi's used it for their racist reasons. For the religions that still use this symbol, like Hinduism and Buddhism, should we condemn them for being racist? NO! They are respecting their faiths and using the symbols set forth to them in writings and drawings. We should look at the Confederate flag in the same manner. Men and women died trying to protect that flag and for different reasons. Should we automatically assume that anyone with that flag is a racist? NO! Not all people who still fly that flag are racist. They are trying to keep the past alive. Not just for their heritage, but to remember a time of when things weren't so great for our Nation and to teach how things need to be different. Many ignorant individuals still use this flag as a symbol for hate. Something this flag was never about.

I could do a brief history on the flag, but it's easy to Google. There were many different designs of the Confederate flag, but people only seem to care about this ONE! Why not look at the state symbols and flags currently in use today that contain their states version of the rebel flag. Florida has the simplest form of the flag. White background and a red x. Tennessee has the rebel flag in their state symbol, as does Georgia and many others. What is so different about this ONE? Why do we focus on something that has nothing to do with another?

Many people will say "this B**ch is clearly racist." Well, guess what? I am not! I am proud of my families past. In a sense, I didn't agree with slavery, but I feel pride in knowing my ancestors were willing to fight to keep their livelihood. They were willing to die for something they felt, in their hearts, was right. There is no shame in that and there never should be. There are people today who give up everything to fight for something they believe in. It doesn't matter if it's right or wrong. At least those people have the balls to stand up and say something and to fight. I wish we, as people, would all be so willing.

Trying to force people into removing the flag and removing memorials to the Civil War is insane to me. Are we going to remove the Lincoln Memorial from Washington D.C.? He was severely racist towards the Native American cultures and people! Are we going to remove Mount Rushmore? After all, it was built by a member of the KKK and has presidents on the memorial that weren't so kind to Native American people. The answer to those is going to be a big, fat NO. Why is it a no? Because they are our presidents and symbols of a "great Nation." We use those memorials to teach our young ones about this nation and why we should all love them. So, why would you not want to teach future generations of Americans and people of the world about how a great Empire once fought itself? Why would you want to say it was all about racism when all it takes is beginner level history to know it was not all about slaves or the oppression forced onto the black community? Why would we not want to tell the full history of what was happening during that time? Not only were we a Nation fighting itself, we were fighting Native people in the west. We, as a nation, wanted more land, more money, more everything and were willing to do anything to get it. Even if that meant fighting each other! Forcing anyone to do something they feel isn't right is wrong. We can use religion as an example. Not all people are religious or of the same religion so why force religion upon them or other religious views upon them. Religious people do not want to hear me saying how I think god is a complete crock of excrement and I don't want to be preached to about god and Jesus and anything to do with religion. I respect peoples choices to be religious or not and to believe in whatever they

choose to. So the least anyone can do is respect my choice. I do not force you to do something so don't force me to do anything. The very same thing applies to the Confederate flag. Not all people will agree and that is ok. Opinions are like assholes. Everyone has one!

If we are to remove things that are seen as racist such as the rebel flag and confederate memorials then we need to remove other symbols and organizations that can be deemed racist. This would involve many places, objects, memorials, etc and many will not like to hear it. We would need to remove organizations like the NAACP. "Founded in 1909, the NAACP is the nation's oldest and largest civil rights organization. From the ballot box to the classroom, the thousands of dedicated workers, organizers, leaders and members who make up the NAACP continue to fight for social justice for all Americans." But they are technically racist because they are for the "Advancement of Colored People". They are there to help only the black community and now other "minorities" to become a viable contributor to our society. We cannot have a white only organization. A couple exist and are racist, such as the KKK, but even if they were not, it would automatically be viewed as a racist group. We would need to remove race only schools, scholarships, etc. If we were to have white only institutions they would be condemned for being "racist." Statues of Rosa Parks, Martin Luther King, Abraham Lincoln, Andrew Jackson and many other would need to be removed for what they were fighting for was during a time of great racism in our Nation. Some of these involved racism in itself. Jackson was the president who forced thousands of Cherokee to walk and die. Lincoln killed and mistreated tribes of the West as he "freed" the slaves. King was a great man who did great things, but for the black community. All men and woman have done great things, but all effected by some hatred in some form or another. We would need to remove the street names, city names, school names, anything that has anything to do with the names of people who were involved in anything race related! Will this magically solve the problem? NO! It will only make matters worse. Because we would be forcing people to once again do things that they never wanted to do. We would be forcing people to sit down and talk to each other. We would be forcing people to stare at the ugliness that is our past and people can't do it and they don't want to it. People would be forced into seeing it isn't just a White and Black issue, but an everyone issue. Native American, Hispanic (multiple Nationalities), Asian(multiple Nationalities), etc! Everyone is affected!

There are so many things that can be seen as racist. Apparently the term "Jimmies" is racist. I was taught, growing up, this was literally the word in New England for sprinkles. Now everyone says it was for Jim Crow. I don't know if that is true and can't find anything on the matter online, but it seems totally absurd and ridiculous. Should people change the way they speak everyday just to appease someone else? There are words used for certain things that did not mean what they do now and some words are seen as "offensive" to some. Why is it ok for one race of person to say a certain word and not another? If you can use towards your own people as a slang term than anyone should be able to use the word. If not, then don't say it. The term fag means a cigarette in the UK. Here it's a derogatory word for a gay man. Gay once meant to be joyous or happy. Now it is a term used for someone who is sexually attracted to someone of the same sex. A simple word used to haunt some people I know. They were called crackers. Should we change the name of what we know as crackers because the term is racist? Everyone only wants to talk about the race issues involving the black and the white communities. What about all the racism towards Native Americans? What about the names of Native people and tribes and "red skins" being plastered everywhere for everyone to see? If we can turn our cheek to that than why don't we have teams and mascots named after the "honkeys", the "niggers" and the list goes on. There are so many terms used for other people it's just insane!

Racism has been a problem in this world forever. It always will be. People haven't learned from the mistakes of the past and can never fully accept the past so we are stuck dwelling on it. Hatred and Racism are learned behaviors as many psychiatrists have told us. So the only way to remove them is to teach our future generations about what is wrong and why those things are wrong. Only then can we fully accept who we are and who we want to become. For this reason I feel there may be another

"civil war" between or nation. Not between north and south, but between political parties and the people most likely to align with them. Literally brother vs. brother, friend vs. friend, etc. When is this ever going to stop? Why is it ok to defile something and commit a crime to make your point? Martin Luther King marched in silence. He then went on to say amazing things to make his point. What he did was well within the confines of the law and he made is point and it was heard loud and clear!

Why are people ignoring the world around them? Why am I being told I owe the black community something? I owe you nothing. You owe me nothing and I am not asking for anything. I didn't own you and you were not owned. Yes my ancestors may have owned your ancestors, but that was over 150 years ago. You have been blessed to be free and to have the same rights as any other human being in this nation that is a legal citizen. I am sorry slavery has existed, but it is something we need to learn from. I don't know how many times I can say that. Maybe people should start to listen. There will always be people who hate someone or something. There is never going to be any stopping of that, but why should people do illegal things to get their point across? Why should people destroy things just because they don't like it or agree with it? I don't like the New York Yankees, but you don't see me destroying their statues or a fans flag on their home. I know completely different contexts, but is it that far off? I am not religious, but I don't go around destroying churches or insulting the people inside of them. I don't agree with most politicians, but I am not out there making death threats against them or hurting them in any way. I will try to speak up and get my word across, but not everyone is going to agree and that is ok. We are entitled with a wonderful gift. A gift that doesn't concern anyone and that is thought. We can think whatever we want and about anything. Sometimes its bad thoughts and sometimes good. Sometimes those good thoughts need to be shared and hopefully they can change the world we live in for the better. Too many times its bad ideas present that cause more bad things to happen!

With the removal of anything racist, we might as well remove anything that causes controversy. Remove the rainbow flag. Remove the don't tread on me flags, remove history from schools, remove all politicians who refuse to follow the law and separate religion from state, remove all illegal people who have come here, remove all money, etc. This list goes on. Why should we remove one thing just because some people don't agree with it? There are many things people don't agree with, but there they are just sitting there untouched. I don't agree with churches or religion so let's remove them. I don't agree with the bible so let's remove them from circulation. People don't like politics in America so let's remove it. The list is endless because there is always going to be people who find fault with everything and anything. We all see things every day that we don't agree with and do nothing about them.

I have been told flying the Confederate flag is the most "Un-American thing" that I can do. Is it more American for me to be burning our current National symbol in protest? Is it more American of me to allow the people of our Nation to stomp on the American flag as a social media craze? Is it more American to sit during the pledge of allegiance? Mostly because of two words. Is it more American to loot businesses in protest? Is it more American to destroy someone else's property? Is It more American to blame anything and everyone for my problems? Is it more American to completely ignore the Bill of Rights and every other important document started by our founding Fathers? Is it more American to force my beliefs onto another individual? Some of these things are seen as "freedom of expression". Well guess what? There is no such thing. There is freedom of speech which is our first amendment right and you could possibly put expression under it. But why would an act of treason against this Nation be seen as more American than simply keeping history alive for everyone to see? How does the term "under god" prevent someone from pledging their allegiance to their nation? Just don't say those two tiny words. It's called respect! Something that is lacking in today's society. I do not understand how something of so little importance can trump so many other things! There are real problems in America and flying the rebel flag is not one of them. How about we focus

on crime, the state of our Nation as a whole, the lack of education for our people, the healthcare for our people (we'll lack thereof), the lack of jobs, the inability for many people to own a home, and the list goes on. All of this most recent debate was over a white man shooting up a church with black parishioners. A rather unfortunate event and I am terribly sorry that people had to die in such a manner, but what happened has nothing to do with the rebel flag. Why is it everyone is always willing to turn a tragedy into some political hoopla instead of grieving first. Every little event has to be turned into some media circus where only half truths are present and EVERYONE jumps to conclusions.

What happened in Charleston was disturbing, but it has happened before. These events have happened at Mosques, temples and other churches and were not just white shooters to the black community. There have been black shooters to white victims, black to Muslim, white to Muslim, white to white, black to black, every race has had something happen to them in recent history in this Nation and all could be classified as hate crimes. Yet we only focus on the one type? Why is it that we only want to pay attention to certain events? All of these shootings, killings, bombings are important. All of them have devastated a community. All of them have left people hurting, but yet nothing has been done to solve the problems in a productive manner. I have seen news reports of how "black lives matter." Don't all lives matter? No one person deserves to live more than the other especially when it comes to race. For those that are religious, we are all created in god's image. So we are all equal!

This individual, who doesn't deserve to have his name mentioned, did what he did out of hate. He used more than one flag to help fuel his hate. He, very clearly, was a sick individual. He only wanted one thing and that was to start a race war. Now everyone who sees a rebel flag or a confederate memorial jumps on the hatred band wagon and is fueling the fire he started! We should be thinking of ways to stop the "race war" and work together to stop the hatred. We, as a Nation, need to come together, grieve for the lost lives and find a solution to all the problems that lie ahead. Flying one type of flag is not going to change anything. People will still use it, still fly it and that's ok. We all see things in life differently and we always will. Like I said before, we are all gifted in thought. We can think what we want, when we want and there is nothing anyone can do about it. It's when we put those thoughts into the world, out in the open that it can actually be helpful or hurtful. This young man's was clearly hurtful. Maybe if more people had noticed what he was writing or saying this could have been prevented.

I am exhausted talking on the matter. I have been told I am too conservative because I support the flying of the flag. I have been called too liberal because I support gay marriage, etc. There is nothing political about the rebel flag and I am neither a left nor a right. I am in the middle forced to choosing someone to govern me because no able bodied man or woman will stand up and say how they feel against the current crap we have in office. This includes ALL congressmen, senators and a president. Our president could have done so many wonderful things and didn't. I cannot solely blame him. No president has absolute power thanks to a system of checks and balances, but that is for another time. Now back to the flag debate. The rebel flag is dead. It's a symbol like I have stated before. It should not be held in the same respects as our Nation's flag or the state's flags. There is so much more I want to say about this and the things I have seen in recent days, but I am just too tired of it all. I'm too tired of trying to argue with people who demand change, but never do anything productive to change anything. In all respects, I feel like the flag deserves to fly on the graves and memorials of the confederacy and a spot in a museum, but most people will not go and see it and we will forget all about it. Like usual, no one has seemed to learn a thing. It seems like every few years something happens to fuel a race debate again and its getting really old! The problems we face as a Nation today are the same problems from many years ago with different faces. Today it's a rebel flag, shootings, etc and yesterday it was statehood, slaves, taxes and expansionism.

I am white, 57 years old and female. My great-grandparents moved from Camden, SC, to just outside Gainesville, FL, back in the 1850s. They took their slaves with them. I didn't really understand what that meant until I was in Columbia for a funeral, and drove down Main Street to Gervais to see our beautiful Statehouse. How could this possibly have been a compromise? No wonder the NAACP imposed its economic and tourism boycott.
