I need your help. Please read at least this first page.

The Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC) performed a Deep Brain Stimulation (DBS) operation on my, Thomas White's, left brain on September 28, 2010. This operation was done correctly and it eliminated the tremors in my right hand. On January 25, 2011 they did a second Deep Brain Stimulation (DBS), called a bilateral, operation on my right side. This operation was not done correctly and it caused many brain movement area problems. Part of these problems include: tremors, vision, choking, constipation, urinary, walk, and balance.

MUSC documented these problems on every office visit. Each visit they tried to correct these problems by programming the DBS systems. Each program corrected the problems but they only lasted from a few hours to a few days and then the problems returned. I found out much later that they were using the wrong techniques; they were using programming for a unilateral DBS system and should have been using programming for a bilateral DBS system.

After many months of having the problems and MUSC not being able to correct them, I went to many specialists and took many tests to try to find out what was causing my problems. They could not discover what was causing my problems but every doctor thought that the operation was causing my problems. As a last resort I went to the Mayo Clinic and after many tests and seeing two doctors I was told that the operation caused my problems.

Since the operation complications set in making the problems permanent. The DBS systems could not be used and everything was removed except the electrodes in my brain. It was deemed too dangerous to remove the electrodes.

Attached are documents that explain this in more detail. Everything is the truth and I have medical records and documents to prove it.

The Medical University of South Carolina refuses to pay compensation for their botched medical malpractice and I need your help to encourage them to do so.

Around December 2011 I started contacting lawyers for a medical malpractice case. All the evidence I had was that before the operation I did not have the problems and after I did. After over 70 lawyers said that I did not have evidence of medical malpractice and they did not want to sue a state agency (MUSC), I tried to get MUSC to prove that they were an honorable and ethical hospital. But that did not work either. Then in September 2014 I found evidence that they committed medical malpractice many times, part of the evidence is attached. With the new evidence I again asked lawyers to help me. About fifteen told me that I had a case but that due to their work load they could not process a case before my Statute of Limitation date of November 21, 2014. Again I tried to get MUSC to prove that they were an honorable and ethical hospital. But again that did not work.

I tried to put comments and information on the Internet -- so far that has not worked. As a last resort I am asking you to help me get MUSC to pay compensation for destroying part of my brain.
