WHEREAS, public health programs and services are essential to a strong, successful health care system that benefits all of our residents regardless of age, race, gender, ethnicity, and socioeconomic strata; and

WHEREAS, public health programs and services throughout South Carolina protect and promote personal, community, and environmental health, encourage healthy behaviors and assure safety and violence prevention at work, at home, and at play; and

WHEREAS, scientific advances have transformed the notion of injuries as accidental, unavoidable occurrences to events that are preventable and predictable; and

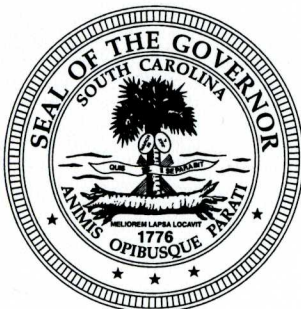
WHEREAS, in 2008, approximately 3,250 South Carolinians died from sustained injuries with unintentional injuries, including motor vehicle crashes, poisonings, and falls, accounting for 70 percent of all causes, while those living with injuries often suffer from lifelong complications; and

WHEREAS, with the theme, "Public Health: Where Do I Fit?" the 2012 observance of Public Health Month helps raise awareness of the role each person has to play in a community and how each action, no matter how small, can impact everyone.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Nikki R. Haley, Governor of the Great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim April 2012 as

throughout the state and encourage all South Carolinians to take simple steps to protect themselves, their families, and their communities because small precautions can make a big difference.
