

Edgewold Postoffice Stops March 1 But Service Bettered

The Edgewold postoffice, a third-class office at 2305 Taylor street, will be discontinued and city delivery begun on March 1, E. C. Goza, Columbia postmaster, said today.

Residents of the section, including persons living at Gonzales Gardens, have had to call at the Edgewold office for their mail. On

March 1, when city delivery begins, mail will be delivered to them by regular city carriers.

Mrs. Mary E. Seibert, postmaster of the Edgewold office, will become a regular clerk at the Columbia office, and two substitute carriers, Dupree L. Gunter and Jack Beaman, will be promoted to regular carriers as a result of the change,

Mr. Goza said. He added that a contract substation would be placed at Macaulay's in the area, offering all services except delivery.

The postmaster also said that two regular carriers and one D. carrier who have been coming from the College Place office would begin to email the main Columbia office April 1. More floor space would be available since outside space for post package has been
