TIDBIT! Each fall millions of hawks migrate south leaving their summer homes for warmer, southern climates. Some species will travel to the southern coasts of North America while others will fly more than 4,000 miles to the forest of South America. To conserve energy on these long flights, hawks utilize favorable atmospheric conditions such as updrafts and thermals. The need to use thermals during migration plays an important role in when they migrate. The migration begins in mid – Aug. and continues until early Dec. with peak flight occurring mid to late Sept. Scientist and volunteers watch the skies for hours, collecting data which is submitted to a nationwide database maintained by the Hawk Migration Association of North America. This data is analyzed to gain a better understanding of hawk migration including population changes. While species like Bald Eagles and Peregrine Falcons have increased. Others, like the American Kestrel have declined. Current and past data can be observed by visiting the Hawk Count website at hawkcount.org.
