SUMMARY REPORT

Meeting of Commission on Higher Education, February 3, 1983

Mr. Fred R. Sheheen, Camden, was elected Chairman of the Commission, and Mr. Robert C. Gallager, Charleston, was re-elected Vice Chairman for 1983. Mr. Sheheen succeeds Dr. James E. Bostic, Jr., Aiken, who was elected on February 2, 1983, to the Board of Trustees of Clemson University. Dr. Bostic had served as Chairman of the Commission since January, 1980.

On November 3, 1982, the Budget and Control Board adopted a resolution which recommends that all colleges and universities submit to the Commission on Higher Education by January 15, 1983, "plans to meet the high technology needs of South Carolina by reordering their internal priorities within existing budgets." The Commission approved a draft response to the Budget and Control Board. Additional recommendations may be forwarded to the Board in early March.

The Commission approved the following proposals for new academic programs: (1) Associate in Business Degree with a Major in Computer Data Processing, Beaufort Technical College; (2) Associate in Engineering Technology Degree with a Major in Electronics Engineering Technology, Horry-Georgetown Technical College; (3) B.S. in Agribusiness, South Carolina State College; (4) Option in Energy Use and Conservation Technology, South Carolina State College; (5) B.S. in Industrial Engineering, Clemson University; (6) M.S. in Recreation and Park Administration, Clemson University; and (7) B.S. in Computer Science (General), USC-Spartanburg.

The Commission approved procedures to be used by the colleges and universities to bring all campus facilities in use up to a satisfactory standard and to assure that this standard is maintained.

The Commission approved a policy to govern the funding of new residential facilities on college and university campuses.

The Commission approved a tentative 1983 schedule for review of college and university 1984-85 appropriation requests.
