Hi Danny,

Thanks for your message. A number of staff members looked into this a few years ago, and you are more than welcome to look at the research file that they compiled. From the records, we believe that A.S. Salley repaired the statue in FY 1908-09. If we go with the assumption that Gov. Blease damaged it again, then it probably would have happened when he was Governor from 1911 to 1915, since he was out of the General Assembly by the time that it was repaired. It may

not have been Blease, but that is the most widely accepted theory. The piece of the cane that supposedly was shot away is at the Confederate Relic Room, but SCDAH staff took it to the statue years ago to see if it fit, and it was not an exact match. This adds another layer to the mystery.

Regarding images of the statue from between 1908 and 1915, we have not been able to locate any. I would try the South Caroliniana Library at USC. We have images from 1895 showing the statue without the lower part of the cane, and we have images of the statue post 1915. Let me know if we can be of assistance or if you would like to see the file.
