MEETING NOTIFICATION - The County Council Members and the Press were informed of the meeting in a timely manner.

CALL TO ORDER – Chairman Coleman called the August 25, 2009 meeting of Laurens County Council to order at 5:30 P.M. in the Council Chambers of the Historic Courthouse located on the Public Square in Laurens. Chairman Coleman invited all to stand for the delivering of the invocation by Councilman Tribble, everyone continued to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL – AGENDA – AUGUST 25, 2009 – COUNCILMAN MCDANIEL made the MOTION to approve the agenda with any additions. Administrator Segars stated that there would be an update on the Fitesa project as requested by Council at the last meeting. COUNCILMAN NASH SECONDDING; VOTE 7-0.

APPROVAL – MINUTES – AUGUST 11, 2009 - COUNCILMAN NASH made the MOTION to approve the Minutes of the August 11, 2009 meeting of Council; SECONDED by COUNCILMAN TOLLISON; COUNCIL VOTED 7-0 to approve the minutes.

Having no one wishing to address Council, Chairman Coleman closed the Public Hearing at 5:36 P.M.

COUNCILMAN TOLLISON SECONDING; VOTE 7-0.

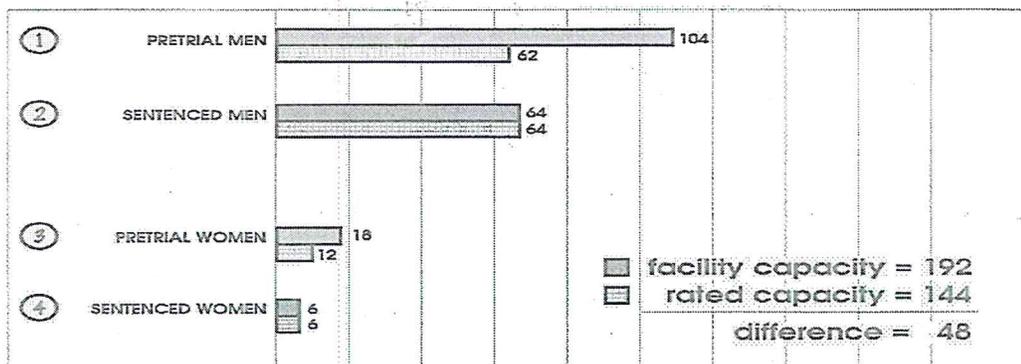

UPDATE – DETENTION CENTER EXPANSION / UPGRADE – Mr. Dennis Ashley, of DA Architects, provided an update of the proposed expansion / upgrades of the Laurens County Detention Center as it relates to future growth.

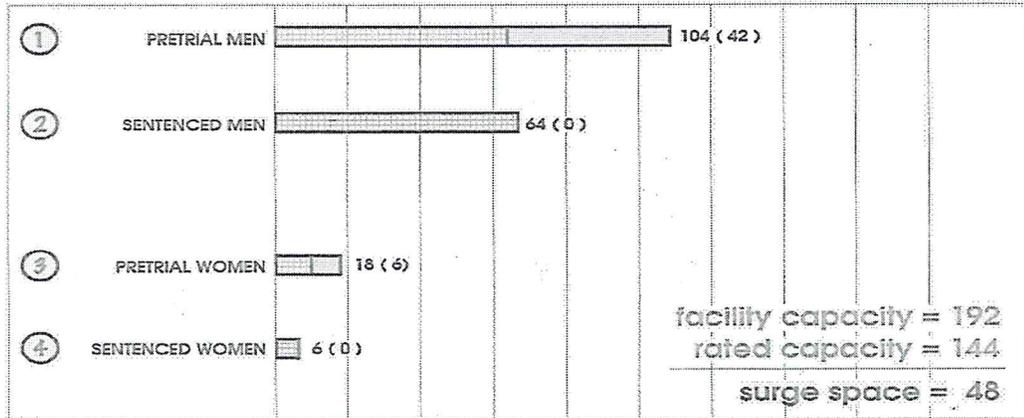
Mr. Ashley said, "To get to this point, we have been actively involved with the jail staff for the past several weeks. What you have before you is what we have concluded as needed in this expansion. The inmate population will only continue to grow. This will provide a \$6.3 million move in ready facility and when completed, the County will need to hire seventeen (17) more employees to accommodate for the expansion."

Mr. Ashley provided the following graphics as further explanation of the proposed project.

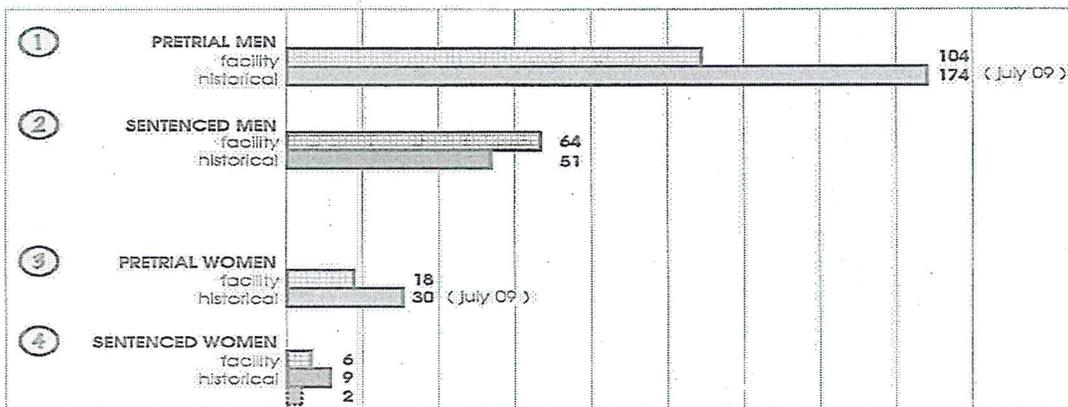
Facility Capacity vs Rated Capacity



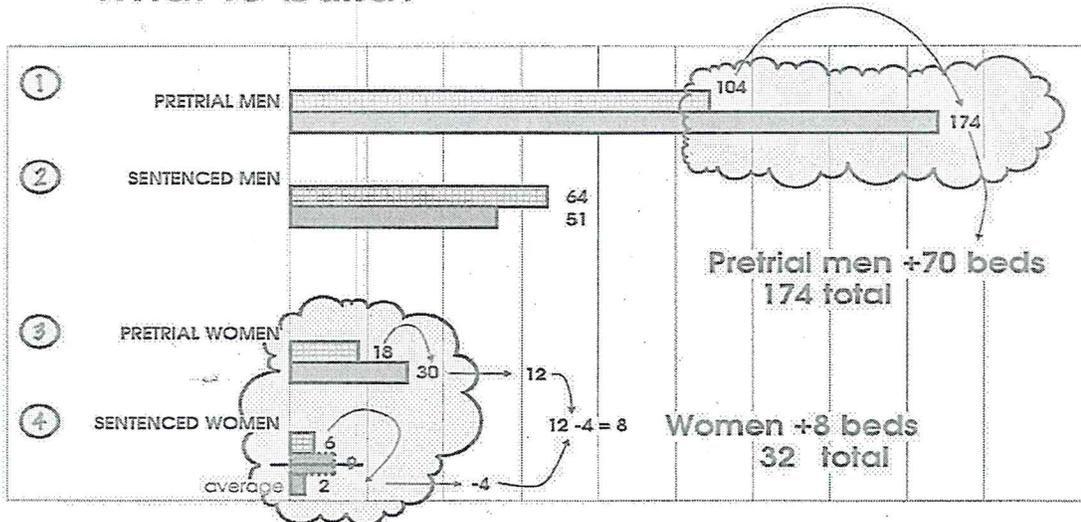
Surge Space



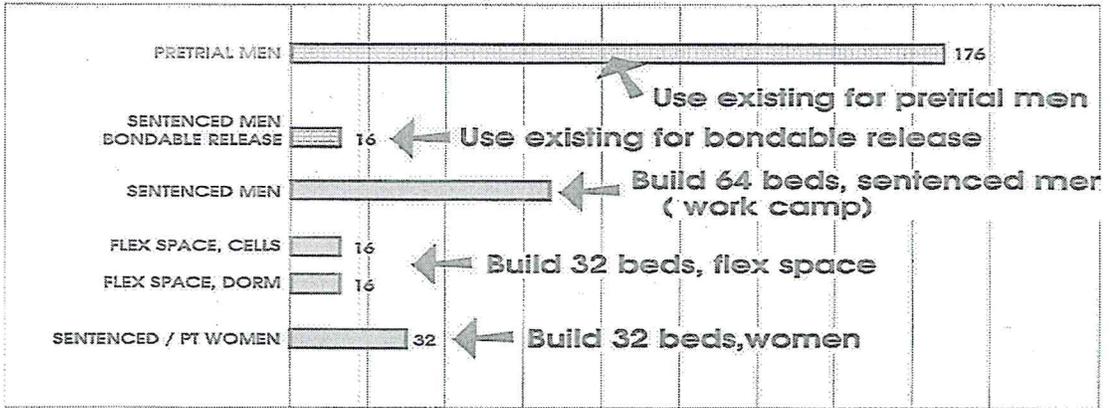
Historical maximum population



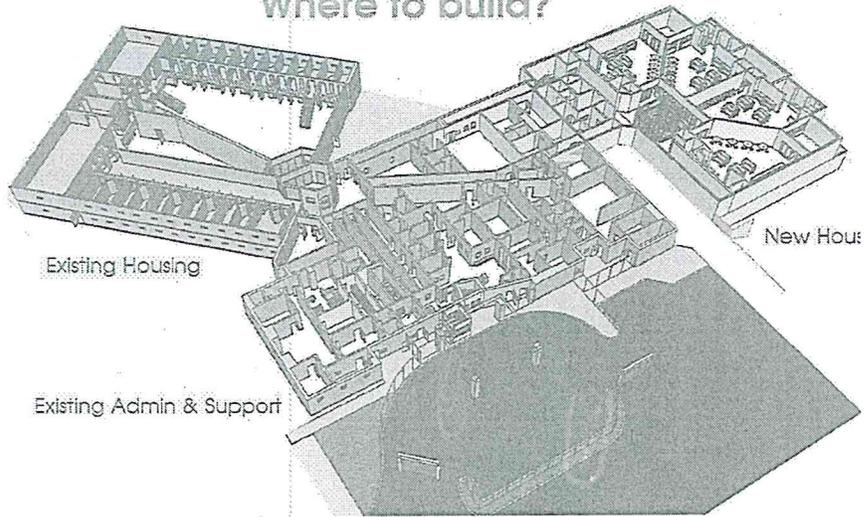

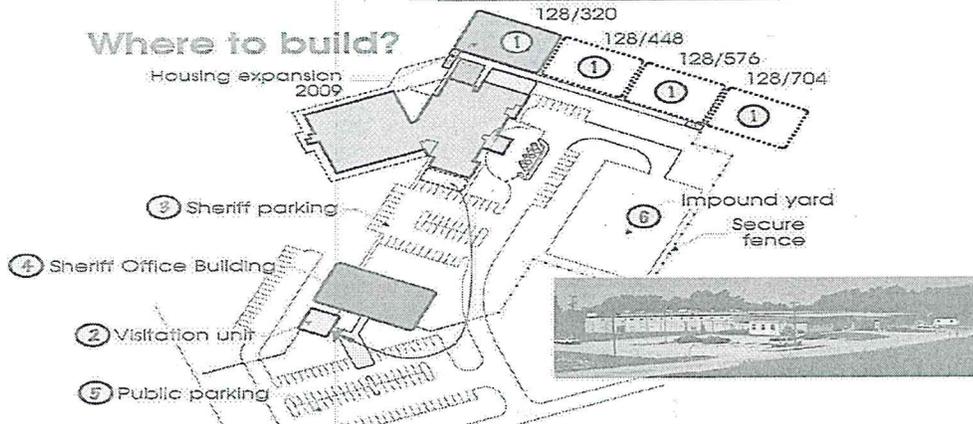
What to build? 128 additional beds 56 beds beyond historical max population



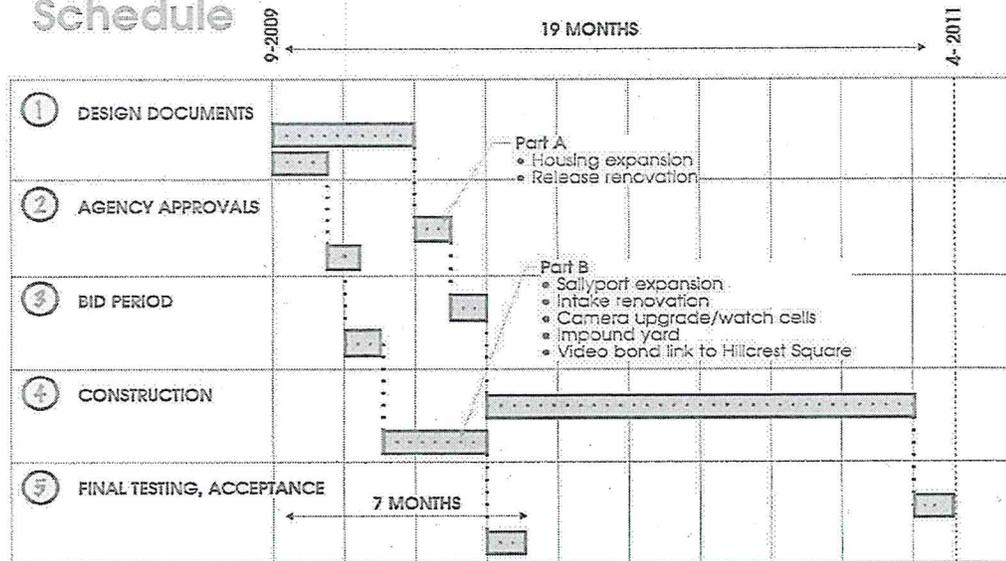

This following estimate is based upon providing an additional 128 beds, a visitation unit, a new medical unit and renovations to the existing intake area, renovations to the current state trustee area for pre-classification holding, renovation for video bond court, renovation of the existing court room into office and a release unit, expansion of the sallyport and a new video surveillance system in both the existing and new facility.

Sheriff's Office Statement of probable costs

This following estimate is based upon providing a multistory, 16,500 sf law enforcement building and site improvements consisting of a secure (lighted, fenced, video surveillance) impound yard, secure (lighted, fenced, video surveillance) parking and visitor parking.

Captain Chris Hudson, Administrator of the Detention Center said, "To address this correctly, this is not what we all want but, is what we all need. All is to be considered a target range of what really needs to happen. I will admit that Mr. Ashley and I do disagree on the numbers. I feel it can be accomplished with less money than projected."

Councilman Tribble stated, "I understand that a higher authority is telling us we need this. Do we really need this?" Captain Hudson said, "All Detention Centers have state conducted inspections on a yearly basis. Laurens County has been fortunate to not have had to consider this before now. With more women being held for pre-trial, we are being mandated to have complete separation. If not compliant, the State will write you up and fine you in most cases."

Councilman McDaniel said, "Folks, they are criminals. You have several ways to look at this. We are dealing with a court system that is broke. The court systems that hire these people to rate the counties say they are going to fine us...then fine us. Has there ever been at time when the detention center was overloaded that no one had a place to sleep, shower, food and medical treatment?" Captain Hudson replied that no one has ever been denied nor turned down with any of these options.

Continuing, Councilman McDaniel said, "We can talk all day about the ratings and fines....everyone in the State of South Carolina is in the same position. If I had my way, and I don't, one thing that I want it to be clearly known is that the Laurens County Jail is not a place where anyone wants to be. The first thing they all say is that they have found Jesus. The social issue is not the question here....they are incarcerated for a reason. A sixty-five year old recently released from the Detention Center came to me and said that we needed to do better at the jail.

Councilman McDaniel asked how many county department budgets exceed the nine million? Administrator Segars replied none. Councilman McDaniel said, "I just can not see spending nine million dollars to house criminals. I understand that they need to be separated from the general population of the County and certainly rubs me the wrong way to spend this kind of money on criminals when there are so many other pressing needs in this County. This Council has to provide these funds for things mandated state. We need to put pressure on the General Assembly for change."

Vice Chair Anderson stated, "It is certain that we all hate to see hard earned money spend this way but we have no choice."

Councilman Wood questioned the work camp quarters and if another elevator was needed. Mr. Ashley replied that there would be a second elevator to accommodate these inmates in this area.

Councilman Tollison asked for clarification as to the earlier referenced seventeen staff...was this seventeen additional overall or seventeen per shift? Captain Hudson replied, "There are presently six to nine per shift. With the new additions this would seven to nine. Schedules could be rearranged to where it could work with less officers. Cameras help, but can never replace officers."

Chairman Coleman thanked Mr. Ashley for the update and stated that Council will take this as information.

Chairman Coleman stated that if any of the guests wished to leave, they could do so at this time.

THEODORE DUBOSE, BOND ATTORNEY – HAYNESWORTH SINKLER AND BOYD – Mr. DuBose began by saying, "The typical way of funding projects of this nature in South Carolina is by General Obligation Bonds....they are the simplest and cheapest way to borrow the needed funds. South Carolina law limits the amount of debt without a referendum. The available debt limit for Laurens County next year will be in the \$10.6 million range and not requiring a referendum."

Mr. DuBose noted another means of funding as being a capital project sales tax where the county governing body can impose one percent sales and use tax by ordinance. Required would be a referendum, within the county area that denotes a specific purpose or purposes and noting a limited amount of time to collect the limited amount of money. The revenues collected can be used to defray debt service on bonds issued to pay for

projects. Laurens County can have this on the ballot for the next general election. The Council would have to appoint members to a committee to come up with projects that would be included in the referendum. Newberry County and a lot of the schools have used this method of funding. If Council elects to go with just the bond payments required, it would be in place longer.”

Council continued to discuss the terms and annual bond payments as follows: Paybacks on \$6.3 million would average fifteen years (15) \$670,000; twenty years (20) \$530,000 at 4.25%.

Councilman Wood said, “I would prefer to take this to a referendum and ask the population and use the Local Option Sales Tax Monies for two years. It could be paid off in two years and not go into debt for eight or more years, I am looking to save this County money.”

Councilman McDaniel asked Captain Hudson, “Based on population trends at the detention center, if we to build this extra space next week, when would we be in need of another expansion?” Captain Hudson replied, “There are a lot of factors that would come into play such as how quick can we get them into the court system....is this a Family Court issue. There is also talk that the General Assembly is going to require a County to hold State Inmates for a year. To answer your question, most likely eight to ten years.”

Chairman Coleman thanked Mr. DuBose for his time and stated that Council would be taking this all into consideration.

PUBLIC COMMENTS – Chairman Coleman opened the floor for public comments at 6:52 P.M.

- a.) Don Strable appeared before Council addressing the current movement as it relates to government implemented family health care. Mr. Strable encouraged Council to consider adopt the European way and learn from the British mistakes.

With no one else wishing to address Council, Chairman Coleman closed the session at 7:00 P.M.

Mr. Skinner said, "The Planning Commission received this report on Tuesday evening and asked that this same information be presented to Council. In addition to the support of the Planning Commission, we would like to officially request to carry-forward the remaining funds within the line item from the 2008-2009 budget year. This would allow for the continuance of the demolition of those started in the last fiscal years."

The request to carry forward the Fiscal Year 08-09 fund balance from the Codes line item account #110.532.41000.42110 in the amount of approximately eleven thousand nine hundred dollars (\$11,900); creating a total amount of twenty eight thousand one hundred fifty six dollars (\$28,156) to continue the work already implemented in 2008-2009 and would cover the expenses incurred for more projects in 2009-2010.

VICE CHAIR ANDERSON made the MOTION to approve the carry over funds as requested. COUNCILMAN TRIBBLE SECONDING; VOTE 7-0.

- 2.) **GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEM (GIS) - JERRY ROBERTSON, LAURENS COUNTY ASSESSOR AND JOEY AVERY, LAURENS COUNTY EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS DIRECTOR**, - Mr. Jerry Robertson, Laurens County Assessor and Joey Avery, Laurens County Emergency Communications Director, were present to inform Council of the recently implemented Geographic Information System (GIS) in Laurens County.

Mr. Robertson said, "This program went live on August 14th and has been very well received. Additional layers will be added over time. We have been advised that there have been an average of eight hundred fifty hits on the site.

Chairman Coleman thanked the staff for their dedication to this project and stated that the implementation of this was certainly an asset to Laurens County.

ASSIGNMENT – PLANNING COMMISSION - Administrator Segars informed Council of dialogue that was held at the recent Planning Commission meeting about directional signage needed at the Laurens County Business and Professional Park. With this in mind, Administrator Segars asked for Council to approve assigning the Planning Commission the task of reviewing the option of signage within the Professional Park for the businesses located within.

Upon a MOTION from COUNCILMAN TRIBBLE and a SECOND from VICE CHAIR ANDERSON, the Council VOTE 7-0 to approve the assignment.
