Tony,

I have teased out some numbers from last year's data. It is difficult because, of the 153 facilities with allotments, only 52 entered data for every day of the year, 78 entered data all or most of the year (350 days or more) inclusive of the 52. Whereas 29 didn't enter any data, 33 entered less than 300 days of data.

For those which entered data every day of the year (52 facilities):

The total allotted number of permit days for the year for those facilities was 1,273,814

The total number of permit days they used for the year was 1,287,780

Which is 13,966 difference or 38.2 beds every day of the year over the allotment.

For those facilities which entered data for most of the year (at least 350 days), 78 facilities (inclusive of the 52 above):

The total allotted number of permit days for the year for those facilities was 1,914,782

The total number of permit days they used for the year was 1,923,077

Which is 8,295 difference or 22.7 beds every day of the year over the allotment.

The total allotment for the state was 3,819,162 or 10,463.46 beds per night.

Of those 119 who entered data into the system (ignoring those providers who entered nothing into the system and four anomalous providers which have special arrangements)

There were 8,025.8 beds per night allocated

The average beds per night in the system was 8,034

So there were, on average there were 9 more people than beds allocated on any night.
