

Then South Carolina's first couple danced along with the state's constitutional officers to "What a Wonderful World" performed by The Headliners.

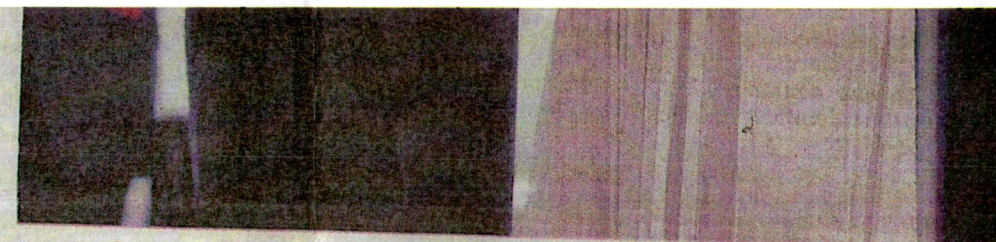
GOLDWATER JR. HITS THE DANCE FLOOR

Barry Goldwater Jr. came from Phoenix for Haley's inaugural festivities.

The son of the same-named Republican U.S. senator from Arizona, who lost to Lyndon B. Johnson in the 1964 presidential race, said he came to support Haley.

Haley is "a contender for president or vice president," he said.

"She's a great leader with a great record," he said, adding it's "too early to say" whether Haley has

a chance at higher office.

Goldwater also had some advice for U.S. Sen. Lindsey Graham, R-S.C., who is considering a GOP presidential run in 2016. "Graham needs to stay in the Senate where he can do some good."

Goldwater's insurance consulting firm, The Goldwater Taplin Group, sponsored a 2011 fundraiser for Haley in Irving, Texas, with suggested contributions of

\$500, the Texas Observer reported.

A special guest at that fundraiser, attended by insurance executives, was Eleanor Kitzman, then the Texas insurance commissioner.

Kitzman, recently nominated to be chief of the S.C. Department of Health and Environmental Control, also attended Haley's inaugural gala.

Kitzman is returning to

the Palmetto State, where the Texas native previously was S.C. insurance commissioner under Gov. Mark Sanford from 2005-07 and, briefly, was director of the State Budget and Control Board. Most recently, Kitzman has worked for a private insurance business in New York.

Open house: 'She'll hug anybody'

Dozens of people lined up to see the newly re-inaugurated governor during an open house at the Governor's Mansion.

Lois Williamson and **Bill Russ**, a Lexington couple, were among the first waiting to pass through security.

The pair, both retired state employees, also attended pre-inaugural activities Tuesday evening.

"I've never lived this close to government," said Williamson, 58, who previously lived in Aiken.

She described Haley as very warm and friendly. "She'll hug anybody."

Haley hugged many of those who entered the mansion. She also said "Go Tigers" to a boy wearing a Clemson sweatshirt.

Haley even posed for a selfie with 14-year-old **Leila Schwab**, who said she was "nervous" during the photo but added, "It was really funny."

Leila's mother, **Suzy Schwab**, said they attend Mount Horeb United Methodist Church with the governor, adding she is proud of Haley. "She's done a fantastic job for our state."

Schwab added her son, who needs an excuse for missing school Wednesday, planned to use a signed inaugural program from the governor as his absence excuse.

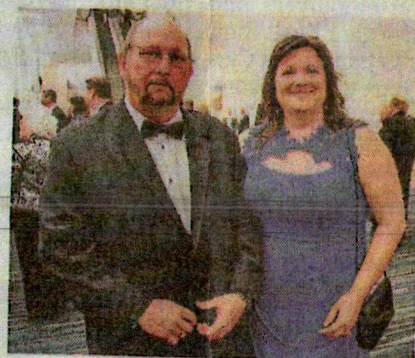
