Historical Information:

Five privately owned, small store buildings once fronted Emma Cudd Road across from the Glendale Mill Village. The former Claude Reaves Store had a business in its ground story and a second story that at one time held Reaves' home. With the Walter Reaves, Sr. Lunch Room (site #1637.01), the LeMaster (later Hopper's) Grocery (site #1647), Dillard's Meat Market (site #1648), and Reaves Barber Shop (site #1649), this store is recommended as contributing to the NRHP-eligible Glendale Mill Village HD due to its close connection with the village and its residents.
