TIDBIT! Sharpnose sharks are the most commonly caught shark off the Myrtle Beach State Park fishing pier. When born, they are 11 to 14 inches in length. Often mistaken for blacktip sharks, these are our only local sharks that will be caught at such a small size. On average, pups grow 2 inches a month during the first three months of life. They seldom exceed 3 feet in length. SC state law allows only 1 sharpnose shark to be kept per day, so please throw them back unharmed because there are days when you can catch quite a few!
