AoA Offers almost \$10 million for Person-Centered Services That Improve Quality of Life for People with Dementia, Family Caregivers

As many as ten cooperative agreements with total funds up to \$9,825,091 are available through the Alzheimer's Disease Initiative: Specialized Supportive Services project. The funds will go to organizations that provide quality, person-centered services that help people with dementia remain independent and safe in their communities.

This project is designed to fill gaps in dementia-capable long-term services and supports for people living with--or those at high risk of developing--Alzheimer's disease or related dementias, and their caregivers.

Eligible applicants are private or public entities that are able to:

- demonstrate the existence of a dementia-capable system, and
- articulate opportunities and additional services that would enhance and strengthen the existing system.

The awards will be made as three-year, forward-funded project periods and have an anticipated start date of September 1, 2015.
