Governor Haley,

I read your article regarding the removal of the Flag from the state grounds this morning, and that if the legislative body of South Carolina doesn't vote in favor of the removal you will hold a special session with them for its removal. I realize there a lot of mixed emotions regarding the Flag (it does not symbolize slavery) and its symbolism but this Flag is part of our heritage and history of South Carolina and is very sensitive to the people of South Carolina. We can't control how people use the Flag or any other object in a harmless way to inflict pain, but the boy who committed these atrocious acts of violence deserves what he gets. He is a pre-meditated murderer through and through and deserves the death penalty regardless of his skin color. I feel for the people, their families and the community. No one would ever dream that this would happen in peaceful, loving and friendly city like Charleston. People come from thousands of miles away to just visit Charleston because we are just like that peaceful, friendly and loving. We are rich in culture and history, and everyone who visits Charleston states "I didn't stay long enough, there is so much to see and I didn't get an opportunity to see everything I wanted to see, I want to come back." This is exactly what this great state of South Carolina needs to see and hear from everyone.

Let me give you a little bit of my background. I grew up in the mid-west in a farming community. A very simple and happy life! My job took me to the South (South Carolina) and I have lived here for 22 years now and South Carolina is very much like the home I grew up in. I was 18 years old when I first moved to South Carolina in 1981. Born in Alabama, I had lived in Georgia and Tennessee, but otherwise I spent the rest of the time moving around the country and world as an Army Brat. I was thrilled to be back in the South. I felt like I was back home.

It wasn't long after moving here that I began to see images of the Confederate flag in various places, whether it was an actual flag, a license plate on the front of a vehicle or on clothing. Here's my white woman confession. I thought it was kind of cute in a "north vs south, it's better in the South, I'm proud to be a Southerner again" kind of way. I had to be TOLD that it was offensive to black people, and in my 18 year old mind, I'm asking, "Why? Don't they like living in the South?" I'll pause while you finish laughing and compose yourself...la de da...all done now?

Ok.

After that, I got it. At least I got it to the extent that I could get it. And suddenly it wasn't so cute anymore. Suddenly the things I'd learned in history class about the Civil War all came back to me, as I had my "duh" moment. Nothing cute about it.

Fast forward to 2015...I am a 51 year old woman still living in Spartanburg, S.C. I've gone about living my life and to be honest, the Confederate flag hasn't really been in the forefront of my mind all

that much. Oh sure, I've seen it flapping in the wind from its perch inside the back of a pickup truck, and I shook my head, rolled my eyes, and went about my business. I still see it on license plates, clothing and more. I remember when it was moved from atop the Capitol building to its current location at the Confederate Soldiers' Monument, on the Statehouse grounds.

Here's something else I remember. I remember the events of last week in Charleston when heaven gained nine new angels at the hand of hatred. I remember the families of those lost offering forgiveness to their killer. I remember being proud of the way the people of Charleston reacted to this incident, coming together rather than lashing out at each other as we've seen in other parts of the country. All the while, that flag kept flying. It kept flying in the face of reason. It kept flying as a reminder of why people hate, and like it or not, it is a loud yet silent message to the entire world that the state of South Carolina is ok with that. A message not just from that person flying it from the back of their pickup truck, but from the very leaders in charge of our fair state. It speaks for all of us, even though it is not my voice.

In case you missed it, John Stewart spoke of the events in Charleston on "The Daily Show". An excerpt of his show made it to many Facebook timelines, where my husband played it one night as I sat next to him. His words stung. He spoke of our black citizens driving on streets that are named after Confederate generals who fought to keep black people from ever driving. He called it "racial wallpaper". He also spoke of the Confederate flag still flying on Statehouse grounds. He spoke of it in such a way that I felt embarrassed to be a South Carolinian.

Many of our God-fearing, law abiding, tax paying citizens are offended by this flag flying in Columbia, and it does NOT speak for all of us. It is time for that flag to come down.

For anyone who wants to talk to me about heritage, honoring ancestors, freedom of this and right to that, just stop. Stop right there. I have ancestors who fought in the Civil War, and if I feel the need to honor them or remember them, it is my right to choose how I go about that. Taking the Confederate flag down from Statehouse grounds doesn't mean it won't be available to those who wish to wear or display it. No one's right to express themselves will be changed. What will change is that there will no longer be an endorsement of division from the State level. What will change is that no child on a field trip to Columbia will ever again see that flag and think it must be ok. What can change is a person's perspective on the subject.

Just as all of those that came before us wrote the history of South Carolina by the choices they made, let's not forget that WE are writing this chapter. WE are responsible for what generations to come will learn about in their history books. Do we want to perpetuate the stereotype that southern states carry in this country and around the world? Do we want to be known for condoning a symbol of racism? Or, do we want to be the state that paves the way, and sets a new tone for the South?
