Thank you for your correspondence regarding illegal immigration. As the daughter of immigrants who came to this country legally, I value the opportunity to work as hard as you can, create success, and fulfill the promise of a better life for your family.

Although we are a nation of immigrants, we are also a nation of laws. Illegal immigration has a negative impact on wages and employment, economic development, social service programs, and state budgets. As Governor, I will not let Washington, D.C.'s failures prevent me from finding solutions to South Carolina's illegal immigration problem. I will continue to ensure that we enforce our state's immigration laws while promoting new ones that protect the best interests of all South Carolinians.

In 2011, I signed into law Senate Bill 20, an immigration reform bill that discourages illegal entry into our state and stops businesses from illegally employing undocumented migrant workers. I also successfully pressured the U.S. Department of Homeland Security to restore South Carolina's access to the E-Verify system. This allows the state to enforce employment laws in an efficient and cost-effective manner. By addressing this issue head-on, we will reverse the tide of illegal immigrants flowing into South Carolina and make better use of our state's resources.
