**Consideration of Addition of Courses to Statewide Articulation List**

The technical college system has identified 14 college transfer courses that they propose be considered for statewide transfer. Many of these courses already transfer, but they have not been formalized through inclusion on the statewide articulation list.

After reviewing a request from USC-Columbia about German 201 and 202, the S.C. Technical College System decided to withdraw these two courses from the proposed list of courses requested to be added to the Statewide Articulation List since they are not actually being taught by any technical college. All other courses are approved for inclusion on the Statewide Articulation List, although some are accepted for elective credit only.

The attached chart indicates the responses that the Commission has received from the public four-year institutions in regards to the twelve college transfer courses that are proposed to be added to the statewide articulation list.

**Recommendation**

The staff suggests that the Committee on Academic Affairs and Licensing recommend to the Commission the twelve courses listed below for inclusion on the Statewide Transfer Articulation Course List (**Attachment 1**): Anthropology 101; Art 105; Biology 225; English 236; French 201; French 202; Geography 101; Geography 102; Philosophy 106; Psychology 203; Spanish 201; and Spanish 202. Inclusion of these twelve additional courses brings the total number of courses that transfer statewide from 74 to 86. The Committee will consider this item at its meeting on September 4 and will make its recommendation to the Commission on September 5.
