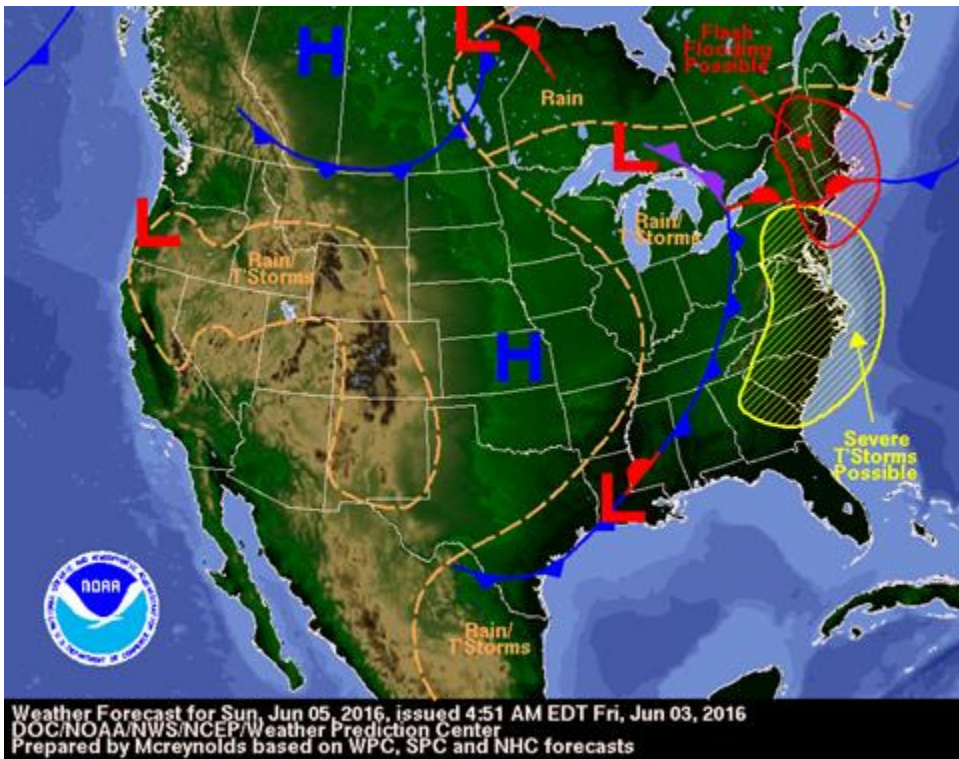

**Subject:** Weather Outlook

**Weekend Thunderstorms** – Expect afternoon and evening thunderstorms – with isolated severe thunderstorms – to break out today through Sunday. The primary hazard threat will be 40-60 mph winds, large hail, and ubiquitous lightning. Sunday is expected to be the most active day, which could produce a rapid 1-3 inches of rain in one area.

**Tropical Outlook** – A tropical cyclone may spin up early next week but effects should be minimal.
