A major water-bottling company plans to build a \$40 million plant in the Pee Dee, creating 40 new jobs by 2016. Nestle Waters North America will produce bottled spring water under the company's Deer Park brand and bottled purified water under its Nestle Pure Life brand at the two-line bottling factory near McBee in Chesterfield County.

**Note:** The 200,000-square-foot plant is expected to open by early 2016 and distribute products primarily throughout the southeastern U.S., according to a statement from Gov. Nikki Haley's office. Nestle is the nation's leading bottled water company.
