On April 2, 2016, people across the country and around the globe will commemorate World Autism Awareness Day, as declared by the United Nations in 2007. It is a day of promise and a time for us to lend our hearts and minds to all who live with autism.

As part of this global effort, Autism Speaks is proud to sponsor the seventh annual Light It Up Blue campaign. Last year we celebrated ten years of progress as the world's leading autism science and advocacy organization. Light It Up Blue is a global initiative aiming to increase autism awareness by, quite literally, lighting the world up blue. We would be honored to have the great state of South Carolina participate.

Last year, over 15,000 iconic buildings, businesses, and homes, spread over every continent, lit up blue. This included dozens of major city halls, state capitol buildings, and governors' mansions in the U.S. as well as numerous landmarks such as the South Pole, Empire State Building, and even the International Space Station!

This April, we plan to expand our reach to raise awareness about autism and light up even more buildings around the globe. There are a few ways you can help:
