Your friend Matthew Bailey suggested I get in touch with you about the feasibility of bringing cost-benefit analysis to the SC statehouse through the Pew Center on the States. I'm working with Pew on a project called Results First, through which we partner with states to implement an evidence-based, cost-benefit model that gives policymakers detailed information to make funding decisions based on results. I live in Columbia and, as a SC citizen, would like to see the state partner with Pew on this project. But as a recent transplant from Tallahassee, FL, I'm still familiarizing myself with SC government. I truly think the governor and the BCB would be interested in Results First as I think the policy analysis approach is consistent with the administration's values of accountability and responsible use of taxpayer funds.
