The Pew Charitable Trusts and the Council of State Governments Justice Center invite you to attend a Criminal and Juvenile Justice Policy Forum in Atlanta, Georgia on July 11-12, 2013.

We are inviting a select number of states to send key decision makers to this forum, including representatives from the legislative, executive and judicial branches. Participants will review recent national trends in sentencing and corrections policy,

examine the experiences of several states that recently have adopted comprehensive reforms, and consider opportunities in your state to maximize the public safety results of your criminal and juvenile corrections systems.

State teams will:

- Hear from state policy makers who have led successful reform efforts;
- Learn about the "justice reinvestment" data analysis and policy development process;
- Network with policy makers from other state teams;
- Receive briefings from national experts on sentencing and corrections policy as well as public opinion research; and
- Participate in state team planning sessions.

Representatives from The Pew Charitable Trusts, the Council of State Governments Justice Center, the Annie E. Casey Foundation, and the U.S. Department of Justice's Bureau of Justice Assistance, among other national organizations, will participate in the forum and help facilitate the sessions.

The Pew Charitable Trusts will cover expenses for two (2) nights lodging at the conference site (the new Loews Atlanta hotel) and up to \$650 per person for air travel (coach only) to the extent permitted under applicable state gifts and ethics rules. Meals will be provided during the conference, but you will be responsible for any incidental charges. Please click on the link below to register for the event. The link also provides you with instructions for making your travel arrangements to Atlanta, and additional information about travel expenses covered.

This is the third inter-branch justice policy forum Pew has hosted that is designed to inform the technical assistance process. Past participants reported that the conference was a critical, galvanizing step in their state's efforts to improve the public safety return on their corrections spending. We look forward to including you in what we expect to be another important event in the nation's evolving approach to crime and punishment.
