

May 28, 1942.

The Budget Commission met in the Governor's Office at 10:30 A. M., all members being present.

Dr. C. F. Williams, Superintendent of the State Hospital, appeared before the Commission and discussed the needs for certain salary increases at the hospital, especially those in the lower brackets. Members of the Commission expressed themselves as being sympathetic with the request of Dr. Williams that such salaries should be increased, but took the position that the Budget Commission was without authority to act in the matter, and advised Dr. Williams that it was altogether within the jurisdiction of the Board of Regents to authorize such increases.

The following payments were approved from the Civil Contingent Fund:

Rex Enright \$40.46 as travel expense on a mission for the Governor.

C. H. Gresham \$50.14 as expense to Washington, D. C., to attend conference on Interstate Trade Barriers, as a delegate appointed by the Governor.

Walter Davis \$80.40 as expense to Washington, D. C., on the matter of Trade Barriers between States.
