Fly Fishing | Jackson County, NC ***Put This on Your Bucket List***

“Trout don’t live in ugly places.” That’s the observation of Alex Bell, owner of AB’s Fly Fishing Guide Service, and whether you’re simply trying to get fly fishing off your bucket list, or you’ve already discovered it’s the best way to spend an afternoon, Alex is the guy to make it happen and Jackson County, in Western North Carolina, is where you want to go.

It’s no accident that Jackson County is home to the first designated fly fishing trail in the United States. Alex Bell is co-creator of the trail and one of the area’s strongest advocates. He’s an expert guide who will take you to the pristine mountain rivers, lakes and streams of Western North Carolina and, at the end of the day, he’ll have done his level best to make sure you’ve caught some fish and had the time of your life.

“For first-timers, I start by having a conversation to discover what they want to get out of their day,” he explained. “Some want to simply try out the sport, while others really have a desire to learn how to cast, catch and release.” They’ll spend an hour or two on technique, then head to the water, perhaps the Tuckasegee River,

with nearly 20 miles of prime fishing to be had. Veterans of the sport might prefer Panthertown Creek, or perhaps Caney Fork. No longer a males-only activity, in recent years, AB's has been host to a number of ladies' outings, in which the traditional spa day for a bride-to-be and her friends is abandoned in favor of a day on some of the most beautiful fishing water in the world.

WOW Factor: All of Jackson County is beautiful, but the water pathways making up the Fly Fishing Trail are nothing short of stunning. Writer Izaak Walton called fly fishing "the contemplative man's recreation." Reviewers on [Trip Advisor] use words like awesome, magical, peaceful, amazing, tremendous, and our favorite. "With Alex Bell as your guide, you will learn something, catch fish, have fun and make a new friend."

Hint: Don't worry about the supplies – he's got everything you need. Remember, no gooey worms to bait – and the flies are small pieces of art that quite frequently fool the fish. Most catch and release, but some want a trout or two to take home for dinner. Either way, you're sure to carry fond memories away from this Carolina adventure.

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Carolina Famous Faces

The Story of Pepsi

Caleb Bradham was born in Chinquapin, NC in 1867. He graduated from the University of North Carolina. And enrolled in the University of Maryland School of Medicine to become a doctor. He earned spare money by working as a pharmacy apprentice. His plans changed when a family issue called him home.

The young man taught school for a time, and then opened a drug store in New Bern. In 1893, he concocted "Brad's Drink," made from sugar, water, caramel, lemon oil, nutmeg and other natural ingredients. Five years later, he changed the name to Pepsi Cola and promoted it as a healthy drink that aided in digestion.

Caleb Bradham married Charity Credle in 1901 and owned a home which is listed on the National Register of Historic Places as the Slover-Bradham House.

In 1902, the Pepsi Cola Company was formed and Caleb Bradham was the first president. Eight years later, the company had 240 franchises in 24 states. And then World War I and sugar rationing hurt the young company which eventually declared bankruptcy and was sold to Craven Holding Corporation for \$30,000.

The inventor remained in New Bern, and returned to operating his drug store. During the rest of his life, he served in a variety of positions, including president of the People's Bank of New Bern, an officer in the naval reserve for 25 years, retiring as rear admiral, and a variety of other positions.

The man would no doubt be amazed at what the Pepsi Cola

Company has become -- [Pepsico](#). In 2013, Pepsi was ranked #1 on Corebrand's list of Most Respected Companies and is a Fortune 500 company. Caleb Bradham died in 1934.
