Dear Press Secretary to Governor Nikki R. Haley:

Congratulations on Governor Haley's sweeping reelection victory this past Tuesday.

As a New York based conservative columnist who began to follow the career of Governor Haley soon after she was elected to the governor's office back in November 2010, I can honestly state that I believe her victory was well earned. Her successes in lowering taxes, creating private sector jobs and reforming numerous state government agencies earned her the appreciation and won her the votes of the voters of South Carolina. If only these, may I quickly editorialize, accomplishments could be achieved on a national level!

I would welcome the opportunity to interview Governor Haley in person election for a future feature story that would view these accomplishments through her own eyes. I would also want to explore the implications her reelection presents on a national political level.

The newspapers that publish my column, which as of the past two years have mainly been interview based feature stories, include the South Asian Times, the Epoch Times and the Long Island Jewish World. .

The South Asian Times, of which I am on staff as the senior editor, is a print and online weekly publication geared to the South Asian communities, mainly in the states of New York, New Jersey and Connecticut. Its combined online and print readership is in the 250,000 to 300,000 range. Both the newspaper's publisher and I believe that these readers would welcome the opportunity to learn more about Governor Haley, one of the only two governors, as you know, who comes from the South Asian community.

The Epoch Times, for which I serve as a regular contributor, is a New York City based print and on line daily publication which reaches a cross section of readers in many of the largest states in America and also in 35 countries throughout the world. Its weekly national and international combined print and online readership is in the range of seven and a half million, of those 218,000 are from the New York area. As a general rule, the editor will publish in print my columns that cover New York connected topics in New York only and will more widely distribute columns that cover more nationally oriented issues. Of course, all of my Epoch Times columns remain accessible online.

The Long Island Jewish World, for which I also serve as a regular contributor, is a weekly newspaper which covers the Jewish communities of the metropolitan and New York City area. Its combined print and online circulation is approximately 75,000; it reaches a predominately affluent audience, many of whom I have learned from the many emails I receive are disillusioned Democrats who have become wary of President Obama and the Democrats and are now leaning towards the Republicans. The Long Island Jewish World will either publish my columns in the exact text in which they appear in the Epoch Times and the South Asian Times, or will request prior to the interview that I ask the interviewee questions considered to be of particular interest to the Jewish community and then include the responses in my piece.

I have forwarded attachments of eight of my recent past columns for you to review. Please note that the first and second are features stories on the great actor, philanthropist and American patriot Tony Lo Bianco, as published in the South Asian Times and Long Island Jewish World respectively; and the third and fourth are feature stories on the American hero of the Iraq War, Captain James Van Thach, again as published in the South Asian Times and the Long island Jewish World respectively. The final four attachments were published in the South Asian Times and also published in the exact same text in the Epoch Times and the Long Island Jewish World.

As I noted earlier, I would be honored to conduct an in person interview for a feature story on Governor Haley. If this would be possible, I would welcome the opportunity to conduct the interview - either in the New York area, in the event she should visit here; or otherwise in South Carolina, in the event arrangements could be made for me to conduct the interview there.

In the event such scenarios would not be feasible, I would remain more than open to conduct the interview over the telephone.
