WHEREAS, employers hire social workers to provide compassionate services for their employees, increasing their job satisfaction and productivity; and

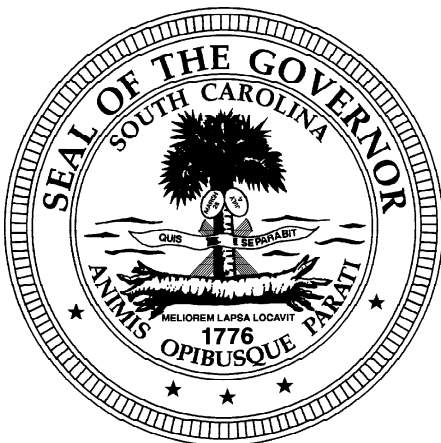
WHEREAS, professional social workers throughout the Palmetto State help individuals, families, and children cope with and prevent problems, saving the community and taxpayers money; and
