**BACKGROUND:**

- Troopers have visited two other schools in the area as part of Lunch Buddies, including Beech Hill Elementary in Ravenel and Northwoods Middle School in North Charleston.
- DeShaun's school was supposed to be the first one to participate, but they asked to delay their visit because of the flood.
- Governor Haley met with De'Shaun on May 21, 2015 in her office. He was accompanied by his mother, LaTrena Elmore, his pastor (Pastor Eva P. Husser from St. Phillip Christian Church), Mrs. Minerva Smith from St. George Middle School, and Mrs. Frizel Elmore, De'Shaun's great-grandmother.

They would like for the Governor to address the following in her remarks:

- Introduce DeShaun Booker
- Give background of the letter he sent her
- Talk about how DeShaun's school is the first to participate in Lunch Buddies
- Explain troopers have already visited as part of Lunch Buddies program
- Discuss expanding Lunch Buddies around the state
- Explain why mentoring programs like this are important.

**TALKING POINTS:**

- First of all, I want to thank Principal Thompson and everyone at St. George Middle School for inviting me to be a part of the Lunch Buddies program today.
- This really is an important program that I hope all of the students here will take advantage of. All of you are getting an opportunity to be a part of something in its early stages that can change South Carolina for the better.
- I've always said that South Carolina is such a special place because of our people, and while South Carolina is still that special place, we have had a difficult year that has brought some challenges.
- Those challenges have shown us that there is room to improve and that there is room for positive change, but the same people who make South Carolina so special are going to be the driving force behind that change.
- We actually happen to have one of those people here with us today.
- You all know DeShaun Booker as a student here at St. George, but I know him as a shining example of a young person who has realized that the power of his voice is as strong as any adult's, politician's, or "grown up's."
- Back in April, when South Carolina was facing a tragedy, DeShaun wrote me a letter expressing his desire to work for change.
- So I asked DeShaun to come to Columbia to meet with me, and we talked about how to change the relationship between the African American community and our state's law enforcement officers.
- DeShaun recognized that, while there have been some tragic situations involving our police officers, they are here to protect each and every one of us and they deserve our respect and

- gratitude.
- Since then, DeShaun and my Department of Public Safety have been on a mission, and that's why we're here today.
- The Lunch Buddies program is only one part of what we are calling the "Today's Youth, Tomorrow's Leaders. Program."
- This is so important because it gives you the opportunity to see these men and women as the people that they are, rather than just a uniform and badge.
- They're here today because each of you are important to them, and they chose to be in law enforcement because they want to serve and protect the people of our great state.
- So I want to ask you to do a few things.
  - A) I want you to look at DeShaun as an example of how powerful your voices are and how much change you can bring if you engage in what is going on in the world around you.
  - B) I want you to take advantage of having these officers here. They're here because they want to get to know you, so please get to know them, listen to them, and learn from them.
- Again, thank you for the opportunity to be with you today.
