Mr. Godfrey earned his B.A. with honors at Rollins College in Winter Park, Florida, and his J.D. cum laude from the University Of Louisville School Of Law in Kentucky.

 - b. The webinar will be broadcast via Adobe Acrobat Connect Pro. Adobe Connect requires the flash player

and a high speed internet connection is recommended. Please visit the website [here](#) to test your system to ensure you are able to log on successfully to the event. Please check your computer prior to the webinar.

2. On the day of the webinar:

a. Enter the webinar using Internet Explorer or Firefox. These 2 programs are optimal for the webinar system we are using—Adobe Connect.
