











- **Hazard Mitigation and Community Education and Outreach (CEO):** Mitigation Advisors, staffing 16 DRCs, provided advice to 69 survivors. Cumulative interview total is 13,344
- **Hazard Mitigation Management:** Screening resumes for seven (7) local hire positions; four (4) Mitigation 406 Specialists, two (2) HMGP Grant Specialists and one (1) Admin
- **The Dam Taskforce:** Dam HMTAP approved. The purpose of task order is to assess the 32 dams breached and identify and develop resources for state and local officials, dam owners and the public. This information can be used to identify potential HMGP projects and inform long-term recovery activities. 
