I am being treat like I did something wrong. I can not drive my car with the window down and a plastic bag across the window. I can not afford to pay \$2,300 to repair a door. This is extremely unfair.... Once this was report, Brittany All with the sheriff department said she did not see a problem in the county repairing this. I am writing to assist civilian complainant Brian Young in relaying his demand letter to you. Mr. Young contacted RCSD regarding damage caused to his motor vehicle during the execution of a search warrant by RCSD and was referred to me. I advised him of the process regarding demand letters (see below email) and offered to assist him in relaying his demand to you.

Projectiles were fired into Mr. Young's home and car during the commission of a crime by one Donnie Dimele. RCSD executed a search warrant on Mr. Young's 2006 Honda Accord to retrieve the projectile, which included cutting away a part of the door (see pictures). Thank you for speaking with me on the phone today about your request to be reimbursed for the damage to your car as a result of RCSD's November 8, 2016 search warrant. As we discussed, I am following up in writing so that you will have my email for future correspondence and to confirm the contents of our conversation.

As I explained on the phone, claims against the Sheriff's Department are opened by and negotiated by the County's Risk Manager, Brittney Hoyle, who is also the person who writes the check in situations like yours, so to speak. She is located at 2020 Hampton St in Columbia, PO Box 192 (29202) and her email is [hoyleb@rcgov.us](mailto:hoyleb@rcgov.us), if you would like to contact her directly. Oftentimes claims are originally directed to me, as was the case here, and I relay them to her. I know the process can be confusing, and I am happy to do whatever I can to assist you in making your claim and relaying it to her on your behalf.

I understand that your car insurance deductible is \$1000, and that though you have not obtained an estimate yet, you anticipate it to be far less than that. Per our phone conversation, you are going to get an estimate to repair the damage and send it to me. You can send me the documentation of the estimate in whatever way is easiest for you – scan or screen shot it and email it to this address as an attachment or in the body, drop it off at or mail it to RCSD Headquarters (5623 Two Notch Rd to my attention), just let me know so I can be on the lookout for it! Good morning, this is Brian Young following up on a search warrant which was complete on November 8, 2016. I originally spoke with Inv. Jordan on retrieving the bullets fired by Donnie Dimele into my home and car. My concern was having the repairs complete once the bullets were removed. He originally indicated that Victims Advocate would cover the repairs, then came back and said they would not. I made it clear, I would not sign a consent until I could clarify how the repairs would be paid for. My car insurance would not cover this repair due to the deductibles, which is higher than the repair. The warrant was issued due to my home and car being shot at by Donnie Dimele. As I discussed with Inv. Jordan, I did not feel it fair that my home was vandalized, now I'm being treated like I did something wrong. I have had a hole in my car from a bullet since March. We have had to take off from work several times to attend court cases, which were canceled. Now, I feel the team sent out this morning to remove the bullet did not care about my personal property. Attached you will find photos of the car. The door panel was not reattached, the rubber seal was left hanging outside of the car, and the door was cut open from the outside. My windows are no longer working. The window is stuck down. I feel this is extreme procedure for the process of removing a bullet. In addition to this, the search warrant has several details that are not correct.

Issues with the search warrant-

Address- The address listed is 2125 Wilkerson Dr. My address is 2125 Wilkinson Dr.

Car information for projectile removal- The car is listed as a 1996 Honda Civic. My car is a 2006 Honda Accord.

Tag information- The tag is listed as FXR-594. My tag is FRX-594

I look forward to discussing a resolution to this issue. As mentioned above, I express my concern with Inv. Jordan, then I was threatened with a search warrant being issued. I look to hear from someone at the sheriff's department on a resolution. My direct contact is 803-238-4978.
