Hey Josh and Katherine! Hope you are well. Harry Cato (Walmart), Lisa McGill Sweatman (SC Retail Association) and I (SC Retail Association) would like to meet with you to discuss H. 3450, the "At Rest" bill. This is legislation the SC Wine and Spirits Wholesalers have been pushing. The legislation was amended (amendment attached) in a Senate Judiciary subcommittee and requires a truck to be unloaded and reloaded at a wholesalers physical location, even if it is being unloaded and reloaded for immediate delivery. It is government overreach, and just creates unnecessary work. The legislation:

1. Creates a barrier to entry for new wholesalers
2. Picks winners and losers
3. Hinders innovative business models
