After a successful first Go-Live on November 5, the SCEIS Project Team is now gearing up for 2008 rollouts. The smooth Phase 1A Go-Live recently in November "proved the system" and is working well for the initial six agencies.

Among the two challenges we face immediately are changes in the onsite Team leadership and in the contracted support team. Regardless of these adjustments, the scope and mission of the Project remain unchanged.

Program Director Chuck Fallaw, who led the team to its successful completion of the Phase 1A launch, has chosen to pursue other opportunities. We congratulate him and thank him for the success of the first Phase.

Preparation for the Phase 1B and Phase 2 Go-Lives will continue under the overall leadership of Dr. Jim Bryant, the State Chief Information Officer; and Pat O'Cain, the Deputy CIO for Enterprise Projects. Chris Shuman will step up as SCEIS Program Director.

Chris is already deeply familiar with the Project, having been involved with the Phase 1A Go-Live. He brings extensive experience with several successful SAP implementations, and will guide the State Team well as they continue to build on the foundation already established.

The Project's immediate future includes a spring rollout for 11 agencies that have been selected as "functional fits" for the existing SCEIS production system. We are updating plans for future finance and procurement rollouts involving additional agencies and functionalities.

We are also reviewing proposals from vendors to assist with the Human Resources/Payroll rollout. The HR/PR team lead, Jennifer Lauer, has assembled a team that is already documenting the State's current processes, in preparation for the rollout of HR/PR modules.

Thank you for your patience, understanding and continued support as the State CIO continues to deliver this strategic business technology for the future of South Carolina.
