As A new resident to South Carolina, a disabled veteran, former law enforcement officer and a citizen, I am appalled at the restrictions placed in this state on CWP participants. I have a current by date CWPs from Arkansas and Montana. So does my wife. I held a FFL for 12 years and held CWP classes at my gun range. I understand being careful, however, when people have had training, have a current license, why the requirement to re-train. I had a current Montana driver's license and I was not required to go through another driving class and pay for that class to get a SC driver's license. The laws are somewhat different for driving in Montana than here. The speed limit is higher on the regular roads. Then, to be told that my current Montana license is no good here, what are we, a nation of borders that cannot/will not allow the citizens to keep something they have already worked and paid for? I submit that this needs to be addressed and corrected.
