Dr. Sumwalt and Dr. Ward appeared before the Commission and requested an allocation of \$4,000.00 to the State Radio Council to cover the expense of the Council in conducting a survey as provided in the Act creating the Radio Council. After some discussion of this matter, action was deferred until a later meeting of the Commission.

The State Auditor submitted to the Budget Commission a report of the audit of the South Carolina Seed Grading Laboratory. A copy of this audit is attached as a part of the minutes of the meeting. Mr. J. Roy Jones, Commissioner of Agriculture, was summoned before the Commission and a lengthy discussion was held concerning the operation of the Laboratory. It was decided that a meeting would be held by the Commission on September 18 at which meeting representatives of the War Food Administration and of the Cotton Seed Crushers would be asked to appear along with any others from whom it was deemed pertinent information may be secured concerning the Laboratory.
