WHEREAS, with symptoms ranging from shortness of breath and fatigue to chest pains, dizzy spells and fainting, PH is often misdiagnosed; and

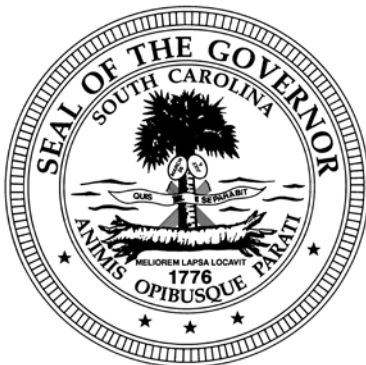
WHEREAS, although there is no cure for pulmonary hypertension, early diagnosis contributes to better management of the disease and an improved quality of life for those affected; and

WHEREAS, Pulmonary Hypertension Awareness Month calls attention to the need for increased education and research as a means to help achieve early detection and diagnosis, effective treatment methods and a possible cure for this disorder.
