#### Description/Significant Features:

This is a 1-story frame residence with brick siding. The house is rectangular in plan with the long side facing the street, surmounted by a lateral gable roof, with a small hipped section at projecting from the left side. The 4-bay facade has an off-center single entrance flanked by a single window on the right and a tripartite window and a single window to the left. A 1-story open porch spans the facade, with a shed roof supported by slender metal posts. A lower 1-story lateral gable enclosure projects from the left side of the house, recessed behind the facade, with an open flat-roof carport in front, supported by wide metal columns. The lot features a modern 1-story detached garage.

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This house is located approximately 2.75 miles north of Barnwell, on the west side of SC Route 3, which is the road that led from Barnwell north toward the Little Saltketcher River, as shown on the 1822 Mills Map of Barnwell District. However, the house is first shown on the 1979 US topographic map. The current research identified no significant historical associations.
