Last year we had to work with the Governor's Office to get a Delegation Letter so that Mr. Magill (DMH State Director) would be authorized to sign the attached documents. And in agreeing to sign the Delegation Letter, the Governor's Office (Jamie Shuster) asked that the Department ensure that the next time these documents had to be signed, that we would provide them to the Governor for her signature, rather than request a Delegation Letter (see attached).

These documents are, again, due. They must be received by SAMHSA no later than September 1, 2012. With that, we must allow for mail delivery time. We need to have original signatures to send to SAMHSA, so we will be happy to pick these documents up from the Governor's Office after she signs them. Once the Governor has signed the documents, we will mail them to SAMHSA with the other required information, including the transmittal letter attached hereto for reference.

The Governor's signature is requested on the following items.

- II. Assurances – Non-Construction Programs
- III. Certifications
- IV. Chief Executive Officer's Funding Agreements/Certifications

To note, the Community Mental Health Services Block Grant is a grant given to States to allow States to address their unique behavioral health issues. States use the Block Grant program for prevention, treatment, recovery supports and other services that will supplement services covered by Medicaid, Medicare and private insurance. For FY2013, the South Carolina Department of Mental Health will receive \$6,363,877 in Community Mental Health Services Block Grant funds.

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
