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Mr. W. H. Garrison, of the State Department of Education, appeared before the Commission and requested the sum of \$1800.00 to employ an additional clerk in the School Lunch Division. The Commission postponed consideration of this request until a subsequent meeting.

Hon. R. L. Gamble, Commissioner of Labor, requested, by letter, an allotment of \$173.00 to pay the salary of an employee who had gone into the Armed Services of the United States. The Commission instructed the Secretary to advise Mr. Gamble that this request would be considered later; and that since the appropriation for inspectors was in a lump sum, he could continue paying salaries from this sum and later apply for whatever amount was necessary for this purpose.
