PUBLIC HEARING

Ordinance No. 14-20, An Ordinance To Amend Ordinance No. 14-02, FY14/15 General Fund Budget, To Amend The Appropriations From The General Fund And Establish The Effective Date Of This Ordinance

Chairman Blackwell declared the public hearing open at 6 p.m. to receive comments on Ordinance No. 14-20.

Sheriff Byrd presented concerns about Council changing the budget in the middle of the fiscal year.

There being no further comments, Chairman Blackwell declared the public hearing closed.

Call To Order / Invocation / Pledge Of Allegiance

Chairman Blackwell called the meeting to order at 6:03 p.m. Mr. Douglas presented the invocation and Mr. Kilgo led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Amendment To The Agenda

MOTION was made by Mr. Kilgo and seconded by Mr. Brock to amend the agenda to move to Personal Appearances after Citizens Comments.

The motion carried unanimously.

Citizens' Comments

Mr. J.M. Smith appeared before County Council several meetings ago to complain about the traffic between Horsepen Branch Subdivision and Northwood. Tonight, he requested on this matter.

Attorney Cox reported that it would cost about \$5,000 to install a locked gate at each end to stop traffic, but allow access for Duke Energy. As a courtesy, the county would obtain permission from Duke Energy.

Personal Appearance - Mr. Winston McElveen, Rubicon Executive Director - Rubicon's FY2015 Strategic Plan For Darlington County

Mr. McElveen gave each Council member a copy of Rubicon's plan and other information. He was available to answer any questions from Council.

Mr. Kilgo wanted to know what services are provided by Rubicon outside Hartsville.

Mr. McElveen reported that Rubicon previously had counselors at Billie Hardee Home for Boys and the alternative schools. Counselors currently go to the jail and the schools. Although Rubicon does not have an office in Darlington, the agency has clients from all over the county. Through a special grant, Rubicon provides transportation for certain services, except the ADSAP (Alcohol and Drug Safety Action Program) program.

Mrs. Johnson mentioned that Rubicon suppose to submit their report to Council by a certain date.

Mr. Douglas presented concerns about there not being a representative from Society Hill on Rubicon's Board of Directors. Mr. McElveen talked about representation on Rubicon's Board of Directors, as well as County Council's appointments to the Alcohol and Drug Citizen Advisory Committee.

Mr. McElveen questioned why Council was considering transferring the mini-bottle funds to Pee Dee Mental Health when Rubicon had been designated, by ordinance, to provide the services for the past 40 years without any complaints. He also pointed out that the County could designate any organization. However, the organization must be qualified and meet state standards.

Mr. Kilgo talked about a deficit in representation from other cities and the need for transportation for individuals in the ADSAP program.

Personal Appearance - Ms. Jessica Cohen, Darlington County Tourism Director - Update

Ms. Jessica Cohen talked about the various organizations that she assists by promoting their events/programs. She provided information on upcoming events in the county.

MOTION was made by Mr. Flowers and seconded by Mr. Douglas to approve second reading of Ordinance No. 14-22.

Mr. Edwards explained that the Development Partnership was a separate fund that later became a part of the General Fund. This ordinance would eliminate the fund that previously existed.

The motion carried unanimously.

Ordinance No. 14-23, An Ordinance To Amend Ordinance No. 14-06, FY14/15 County Fire District Fund Budget, To Reduce Funds For The Lease Purchase (Initiated by the staff) - **SECOND READING**

MOTION was made by Mr. Kilgo and seconded by Mrs. Johnson to approve second reading of Ordinance No. 14-23.

Mr. Edwards explained that \$1.7 million was placed in the Fire District Budget with no revenue to support it. Therefore, this ordinance would take the funds out of the budget until such time that Council may be ready for a bond issue or referendum.

The motion carried unanimously.

Ordinance No. 14-24, An Ordinance To Amend Ordinance No. 14-02, FY14/15 General Fund Budget, To Remove Accommodations Tax Funds From The General Fund Budget And Place Into A Newly Established Fund For Accommodations Tax (Initiated by the staff) - **SECOND READING**

MOTION was made by Mr. Kilgo and seconded by Mr. Douglas to approve second reading of Ordinance No. 14-24.

Mr. Edwards explained that this ordinance would simplify the accounting process by establishing a separate fund for Accommodations Tax. Currently, the Accommodations Tax funds were mixed with other funds.

The motion carried unanimously.

Ordinance No. 14-25, An Ordinance To Amend Ordinance No. 14-02, FY14/15 General Fund Budget, To Include Bond Payments And Interest For FY14/15 And Expenditure For The Airport Acquisition Project – As Amended (Initiated by the staff) - **SECOND READING**

MOTION was made by Mr. Kilgo and seconded by Mr. Flowers to approve second reading of Ordinance No. 14-25.

The motion carried unanimously.

Ordinance No. 14-26, An Ordinance To Amend Ordinance No. 14-02, FY14/15 General Fund Budget, To Create An Asset Account For Accommodations Tax And To Remove Accommodations Tax Funds From The Fund Balance Account (Initiated by the staff) - **SECOND READING**

MOTION was made by Mr. Flowers and seconded by Mr. Douglas to approve second reading of Ordinance No. 14-26.

Mr. Edwards explained that this ordinance would move Accommodations Tax funds from general government to the Accommodations Tax Fund.

The motion carried unanimously.

Ordinance No. 14-27, An Ordinance To Establish A Countywide Business Registration Fee (Initiated by Councilman Kilgo) - **SECOND READING**

MOTION was made by Mr. Kilgo and seconded by Ms. Nicholson to approve second reading of Ordinance No. 14-27.

Mr. Kilgo pointed out that according to state statute, the registration fee could not be more than \$15 per business.

Mr. Flowers was concerned that the amount of revenue generate from the registration fee would not be worth the intrusion, manpower, and expense for collecting the funds.

Mr. Kilgo clarified that the registration fee would be coordinated with personal property taxes and would allow the Auditor to ensure that the county was collecting the proper amount of personal property taxes from businesses. This could be done by attaching the registration fee to the property tax notice instead of a separate registration.

Those voting in favor of the motion were Mr. Kilgo and Ms. Nicholson. Opposing were Mr. Flowers, Mr. Brock, Mr. Hudson, and Mr. Douglas. The motion failed.

Chairman Blackwell read the title of Ordinance No. 14-28 for first reading.

The motion carried unanimously.

MOTION was made by Mr. Hudson and seconded by Mr. Douglas to approve the temporary Local Emergency Management Program grant funded position for EMS.

The motion carried with Mr. Kilgo opposing.

CTC Funds For Survey & Feasibility Study Of Cross Swamp Road, CPCNP028258, \$15,000

MOTION was made by Mr. Hudson and seconded by Mr. Flowers to approve acceptance of CTC funds for survey and feasibility study of Cross Swamp Road.

The motion carried unanimously.

CTC Funds For Road Improvements To North Charleston Road, Beaverdam Road, Ackerman Drive, White Drive, Timmons Drive, & Marcus Drive, CPCNP028259, \$390,555

MOTION was made by Mr. Flowers and seconded by Mr. Hudson to approve acceptance of CTC funds for improvements to the above listed roads.

The motion carried unanimously.

MOTION was made by Mr. Brock and seconded by Mr. Douglas to approve the Mutual Aid Agreement between Lexington County Sheriff's Department and Darlington County Sheriff's Department.

The motion carried with Mr. Kilgo and Ms. Nicholson opposing and Mrs. Johnson not voting.

Request To Purchase 0.36 Acres Near The Entrance Of The I-20/340 Industrial Park, \$5,000

MOTION was made by Mr. Kilgo and seconded by Mr. Hudson to approve the purchase of 0.36 acres near the entrance of the I-20/340 Industrial Park for \$5,000.

The motion carried unanimously.

Purchase Of Fire Equipment For Darlington County Fire District Substation 6, Ashland Area

MOTION was made by Mrs. Johnson and seconded by Mr. Flowers to approve the purchase of fire equipment from Newton's Fire and Safety Equipment, in the amount of \$28,326.27, for Darlington County Fire District Substation 6.

The motion carried unanimously.

Request Funds For Employees' Appreciation Banquet

MOTION was made by Mr. Douglas and seconded by Mr. Hudson to approve the request for \$5,000 for the Employees' Appreciation Banquet from funds available from Workers Compensation Payroll Audit.

The **MOTION** was amended by Mr. Kilgo and seconded by Mr. Hudson to add an additional \$2,000 to pay for employees' guest.

The motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Blackwell called for the vote on the motion, as amended. The motion carried unanimously.

County Water Recreation Resources/SCDNR Funds (\$91,827) & US Fish & Wildlife Sportfish Restoration Boating Access Funds (\$275,482.35) For Construction Of Boat Landing At Louther's Lake And Paving Of Parking Area & Whipple Landing Drive

MOTION was made by Mr. Douglas and seconded by Mr. Hudson to approve acceptance of the grant funds to construct a boat landing at Louther's Lake and pave the parking area and Whipple Landing Drive.

The motion carried unanimously.

Request From Habitat For Humanity For The County To Waive The Fee(s) For Review Of House Plans And Building Permits

MOTION was made by Mr. Brock and seconded by Mr. Hudson to approve waiving the plan review and permit fees in the amount of \$1,813 for Habitat for Humanity.

The motion carried unanimously.

Consent Agenda

There were no consent agenda items.

Administrative Update - Mr. Ken McRae, Recreation Director - Future Recreation Development Project

Lake Darpo Archery Range. Mr. McRae reported that in order to obtain funds for an archery range, archery has to be taught in the school system. Local DNR (Department of Natural Resources) officials are proposing to approach the School District about having archery classes in some of the schools.

Black Creek Boat Landing. Mr. McRae stated that there exists an agreement with the United States Department of Interior and South Carolina Department of Transportation for federal funds to build a boat landing at the base of a new or renovated bridge. With the widening of Highway 52, two new bridges would be installed and a boat landing could be installed at the base of one of them. With Council's approval, Mr. McRae will send a letter to South Carolina Department of Transportation Commission to pursue this.

Lake Darpo Development Project. Mr. McRae reported that the county has 67 acres at Lake Darpo that could be developed to generate an alternate source of revenue. The County has an agreement with the State Forestry Commission for trails, replanting, etc. He requested guidance from Council as to whether to pursue funds for other amenities (Plan A and Plan B as included in Council's agenda package).

MOTION was made by Mr. Kilgo and seconded by Mr. Flowers for Mr. McRae to move proceed with discussions regarding the Black Creek Boat Landing and Lake Darpo Development Project.

The motion carried unanimously.

Administrative Update - Mr. Tommy Edwards, Interim County Administrator

Mr. Edwards explained that the county's reassessment was concluded at the end of calendar year 2013. With the roll back in taxes, the county would receive the same amount of money as the prior year, with the exception of new constructions. He further explained

that when the budget was adopted in the Spring, Council was given a figure for taxes that included the CPI (consumer price index) increase and the taxes were increased accordingly. However, the roll back did not happen. Mr. Edwards said Council should have been informed and given information for consideration when the budget was adopted or prior to sending out the tax notices. As a result, the taxpayers were over billed based upon the fact that the rollback did not occur. The correction would have to be made on the tax notices for 2015. Mr. Edwards stated that what occurred was accidental, but illegal because state law specifically states that the county shall not reap a windfall from reassessment. If the assessed value increases a certain percentage, the tax rate has to be adjusted accordingly to bring in the same amount of taxes.

Mr. Kilgo suggested that the county send out corrected tax notices and refund those who have paid their taxes.

Chairman Blackwell suggested setting the funds aside and adjusting the next tax notices.

Mr. Edwards indicated that the staff would have the numbers within a few days. He recommended that the county go public about the mistake and correct it next year on the tax notices. Mr. Edwards talked about the roll back, local option sales tax, and the remaining balance that was not applied to the roll back. He said state codes give County Council the absolute authority to make the roll back calculations. Mr. Edwards suggested that the Finance Committee review this matter.

Mr. Edwards also reported that it appears that the Accommodations Tax was implemented years ago, but not by ordinance.

Mr. Kilgo pointed out that the homestead exemption was not properly posted on some accounts.

Chairman Blackwell suggested that these matters be referred to a committee and a recommendation presented to Council.

Mr. Edwards stated that there would need to be an ordinance for the millage rate, which has to be adjusted to determine the availability of revenues that would go into the budget.

Chairman Blackwell clarified that the issues were the rollback did not occur and money from the Local Option Sales Tax was not applied on the credit for the Local Option Sales Tax.

Requests / Comments – Members Of Council

Mr. Brock suggested that a committee be formed to figure out what happened and ensure that it does not happen again.

Amendment To FY2014/2015 General Fund Budget To Reduce Cost Per Page For Copies

MOTION was made by Mr. Hudson and seconded by Mr. Douglas for Council to revisit the section of the General Fund Budget Ordinance to reduce the cost for copies from \$1 per page back to twenty-five cents per page.

The motion carried with Mr. Blackwell and Mr. Kilgo opposing.

Requests / Comments – Members Of Council Continue

Ms. Nicholson requested a copy of the minutes where she questioned the auditors and commented about the responsibilities of the Finance Committee.

Mrs. Johnson stated that at a previous Council meeting, she mentioned that the old post office building located on Pearl Street in Darlington was back on the market. She also talked about the Local Option Sales Tax and the Accommodations Tax.

Mrs. Johnson read the title of an ordinance that she was requesting to be placed on Council's next agenda for first reading (*Ordinance No. 14-31, An Ordinance To Amend Ordinance No. 14-02, FY14/15 General Fund Budget, To Amend The Appropriation From The General Fund Budget To Purchase The Old Darlington Post Office Located At The Corner Of Dargan Street And Pearl Street For The Home Of Darlington County Historical Museum/Gallery At A Cost Of \$190,000 And Establish The Effective Date Of This Ordinance*). She presented information as to the purpose of the Darlington County Historical Museum/Gallery.

Mr. Flowers reported that there was a discrepancy in the salary for CDL drivers/motor equipment operators at the landfill and other employees with the same positions. He asked Mr. Edwards to look at this and find out whether an adjustment can be made in order to treat the drivers equally. Mr. Edwards will provide a report.

Mrs. Nicholson also presented concerns about inequality in salaries of county employees.

Presentation to Chairman Wesley Blackwell

On behalf of County Council, Ms. Nicholson honored Chairman Blackwell by presenting him a gift and plaque in appreciation for 16 years of service on Darlington County Council.

Chairman Blackwell indicated that he served on County Council for four years, went off, and then came back for 16 years.

Council recessed at 8:27 p.m. prior to going into executive session and reconvened at 9:40 p.m.

MOTION was made by Mr. Kilgo and seconded by Ms. Nicholson to spend up to \$30,000 for redesign of the South Darlington retention pond.

The motion carried with Mr. Flowers opposing.

Candidates For County Administrator Position

Chairman Blackwell announced the top three candidates for the County Administrator position (Mr. Terry M. Josey, Mr. Jon Caime, and Mr. Terence Arrington).
