We started this group because we are extremely tired of the rise in death in domestic violence in South Carolina and victims of abuse increasing each year. The death totals are unspeakably at a high amount and our Change fighters want laws enforced to keep innocent people safe in domestic violence situations and or abuse situations. South Carolina is not doing enough to get the numbers down in abuse, domestic violence or death.

We have several items that we demand to be changed for citizens who are survivors of domestic violence and or abuse in South Carolina. We know that if laws were enforced and accountability for all authorities and agencies were demanded to enforce accountability then we know lives could be saved and the number of actual crimes would decrease and number of cases and deaths would decline. NEW LAW SUGGESTIONS FOR SOUTH CAROLINA DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND ABUSE SURVIVORS

Cease perpetrators from getting records of expungement when it involves an Abuse Case or Domestic Violence Case so that pass charges are not covered up allowing them to commit the crime again.

If there is a victim of Domestic Violence and or Abuse that in no certain term can a group, or organization target them with retaliation and cause them harm in any way be it psychologically, physically or emotionally and under no uncertain terms do they have the right to pull up heritage information to hurt them publicly or in a career. If this is done the victim has the right to bring charges against various people.

If a Guardian, DSS Workers or Judge, etc. has a case which involves a Criminal Domestic Violence on a victim and something goes wrong, we want a law to be passed called Riley's law where people are held accountable if the case is not handled properly by assigned individuals. Let the individuals be subject to being charged for what happened to the victim.

Every victim of Criminal Domestic Violence or Child Abuse should be appointed a lawyer, pro bono, to protect them and not the perpetrators if they are charged for a crime making they pay for legal counsel, not the victims. Too many times the law breakers receive counsel for free while the innocent get no assistance in legal fights.

Under no certain terms should there be any favoritism in government positions or state or county positions pertaining to Domestic violence or Abuse or any other crime. The judicial system should not be discriminating in any way status quo, race, heritage, etc...or avoid punishments due to status quo.
