Nikki,

We have never met, but I wanted to send you a note. I have no idea if you will receive this, but I hope you do.

First - I commend you for recognizing the confederate flag needs to come down.

Second - as a mother of 3 children, I have to say that I have been in denial about racism in South Carolina and the genuine feelings of hatred that the confederate flag symbolizes to some people. Although I lived here in South Carolina most of my life, I've just been oblivious.

I grew up on a farm in Southern Indiana. The closest thing to diversity were the Amish people in our community. I didn't attend school with any black children, Asian children, or Hispanic children, and I didn't think American Indians still existed. Then I married and moved to Charleston. I worked for a company that employed predominantly African American people, many of which were single moms that worked two jobs (and by the way, they preferred to be called black). I'd never seen anything like it. One of my best friends who has since passed away was a black woman. We used to walk every day and I remember walking with her during a Walk America event in downtown Charleston and she showed me a hospital. She said that used to be the black hospital that she had to go to when she was

little. I looked at her and said, why would they paint those white bricks black, wouldn't that make the building even hotter? She just shook her head and laughed at me. Yes, I admit it, I was clueless. And when she told me what it really meant, I was mortified. In my mind that was just stuff we ready about that existed a million years ago. I loved this woman and she was like a mother to me; I couldn't imagine anyone treating her any differently than me.

I lived there for 8 years then moved around with my husband's career and we have settled in Columbia and will be here the rest of our lives. When the confederate flag issue was raised in the past I always thought, well, I'm not from SC so it's not my circus, not my issues, and I never really cared whether it was there or not. But oddly enough, I remember being appalled when the Ten Commandments plaque was requested to be taken out of the state house. I don't know what happened since then, if it remained or not, but I was truly upset.

When innocent South Carolinians were killed last week because of the color of their skin, I realized, this is my home, and this is now my circus, and I need to take a stand. The confederate flag reminds me of the Dukes of Hazzard, a TV show from my youth; but it reminds black South Carolinians that they were once enslaved and abused, and even people that I loved in my own lifetime were segregated, mistreated, and not even allowed to use the same hospital as I would have been.

In all honesty, I hope this tragic even can bring us together and closer as a nation and as a state. I think if you can get that flag removed and put away in a museum and that can remove a symbol of oppression to our population here in South Carolina then we will be making great strides towards the harmony that I thought already existed. Racism is real. As much as I don't want to admit it, it is still alive in South Carolina and the only thing I can do about is try to teach my children and future generations that we assess people by their actions or inactions, not by the color of their skin. My 15 year old daughter tearfully told me last night that the pastor of the church said that he forgave the shooter and asked God to have mercy on his soul. If the black community of that church can be so humbled to pray for a person that has killed their family members, then I say the very least that we can do as a white community to support our fallen brothers and sisters, is to take down the flag that may continue to perpetuate the hatred that caused the shootings.

My family fully supports your intention to remove the confederate flag!

Hello: I'm writing to share an experience while I was traveling through South Carolina. A young man who I met in the Raleigh NC area, who I still consider a friend - had me tag along on his way moving down to Tampa, FL with some friends - to plant a church. My friend's name is Jay [REDACTED] and he spent time living in Loris, SC along with his father Rocky and Francis [REDACTED]. Rocky was, and I believe still is, a pastor of some sort. During candid conversations with Rocky when he let his guard down and apparently felt some of these ideas were welcome, he revealed that he (and his congregation) do not want or welcome 'black people' to their services. This was somewhat appalling but at the time I felt as though I was on this strange journey to help move my friend, and I was a guest in their house - so didn't 'make a scene.' As I think about the recent national news related to Emanuel A.M.E. Church, I felt that perhaps my one data point, and frankly 'real' experience with a 'real' South Carolinian was more telling and sadly representative (having only visited prior on family vacations to your beaches) than a one-off backwards town or individual. I am aware that sharing this information, depending on how it's used, could damage Rocky - but it was and is flat wrong to express such views and those ideas should be exposed for what they are. I will be reaching out to local community leaders in the Loris area as well but would appreciate guidance on how to proceed. I was unsure how to categorize this message but choose 'Commerce/Economic Development' as this seemed to be the closest.

I am more proud to be an American as I witness progress in civil rights and race relations in the last

few years, and have been given hope by the response of many politicians and companies to the latest heinous acts.

Governor Haley,

My ancestor, Robert [REDACTED] of Company [REDACTED] South Carolina Infantry, Joined the Confederate army in March 1862.

Robert [REDACTED] had a wife and two children, and lived on a farm in Lee County. Robert [REDACTED] owned no slaves. I AM NOT ALONE AS A NON-BLACK RACIAL AND RELIGIOUS MINORITY IN FEARING THAT FLAG. I GREW UP IN WESTERN NC FROM 1980 TO PRESENT. I HAVE TOO MANY EXAMPLES OF THE FLAG USED TO OVERTLY CREATE FEAR AMONG MY FAMILY AND FRIENDS TO TOLERATE THE MISGUIDED NOTION THAT THIS FLAG SHOULD NOT BOTHER ANYONE. THE FLAG HAS BEEN LEFT WITH WHITE SUPREMIST LITERATURE ON OUR LAWNS, IN OUR MAIL BOX AND IN THE BATHROOMS OF OUR FAMILY BUSINESSES. ON MY MOTHER'S SIDE WE LOST A TREMENDOUS AMOUNT OF FAMILY DURING THE HOLOCAUST. WE CANNOT IMAGINE ANY STATE IN GERMANY FLYING THE NAZI FLAG DESPITE THE HERITAGE. WE VIEW THE CONFEDERATE FLAG AS NO DIFFERENT.

IT IS IMPORTANT THAT THE SC LEGISLATURE CONSIDER THE ACTUAL AND MORE RECENT HISTORY OF THE FLAG IN MAKING AN UPCOMING DECISION. THE REBEL FLAG WE KNOW TODAY WAS NOT IN COMMON USAGE AFTER THE CIVIL WAR EXPECT AT VETERAN'S

GATHERINGS OR MEMORIALS. IT CAME INTO COMMON USAGE AS A SYMBOL OF DEFIANCE AGAINST CIVIL RIGHTS PROGRESS AROUND THE TIME OF BROWN V. BOARD OF EDUCATION. DISPLAYS OF THE FLAG BECAME MORE AND MORE COMMON THROUGH OUT JIM CROW SOUTH IN DIRECT OPPOSITION TO CIVIL RIGHTS MOVEMENT. I DO BELIEVE THAT MANY WHOM DISPLAY THE FLAG ARE IGNORANT OF ITS MORE RECENT SYMBOLISM.

THERE HAS BEEN MOVEMENT IN THE SOUTH TOWARD YOUR POSITION FAMILY BY FAMILY AND YEASR BY YEAR. I HAVE WATCHED AS THE WHITE SOUTHERN FAMILIES OF MANY OF MY FRIENDS HAVE TAKEN DOWN ALL CONFEDERATE FLAGS AND OTHER "REBEL" ITEMS OVER THE LAST 20 YEARS AS THEY BECAME MORE SENSITIVE AND KNOWLEDABLE OF ITS HISTORY. Nikki,

We have never met, but I wanted to send you a note. I have no idea if you will receive this, but I hope you do.

First - I commend you for recognizing the confederate flag needs to come down.

Second - as a mother of 3 children, I have to say that I have been in denial about racism in South Carolina and the genuine feelings of hatred that the confederate flag symbolizes to some people. Although I lived here in South Carolina most of my life, I've just been oblivious.

I grew up on a farm in Southern Indiana. The closest thing to diversity were the Amish people in our community. I didn't attend school with any black children, Asian children, or Hispanic children, and I didn't think American Indians still existed. Then I married and moved to Charleston. I worked for a company that employed predominantly African American people, many of which were single moms that worked two jobs (and by the way, they preferred to be called black). I'd never seen anything like it. One of my best friends who has since passed away was a black woman. We used to walk every day and I remember walking with her during a Walk America event in downtown Charleston and she showed me a hospital. She said that used to be the black hospital that she had to go to when she was little. I looked at her and said, why would they paint those white bricks black, wouldn't that make the building even hotter? She just shook her head and laughed at me. Yes, I admit it, I was clueless. And when she told me what it really meant, I was mortified. In my mind that was just stuff we ready about that existed a million years ago. I loved this woman and she was like a mother to me; I

couldn't imagine anyone treating her any differently than me.

I lived there for 8 years then moved around with my husband's career and we have settled in Columbia and will be here the rest of our lives. When the confederate flag issue was raised in the past I always thought, well, I'm not from SC so it's not my circus, not my issues, and I never really cared whether it was there or not. But oddly enough, I remember being appalled when the Ten Commandments plaque was requested to be taken out of the state house. I don't know what happened since then, if it remained or not, but I was truly upset.

When innocent South Carolinians were killed last week because of the color of their skin, I realized, this is my home, and this is now my circus, and I need to take a stand. The confederate flag reminds me of the Dukes of Hazzard, a TV show from my youth; but it reminds black South Carolinians that they were once enslaved and abused, and even people that I loved in my own lifetime were segregated, mistreated, and not even allowed to use the same hospital as I would have been.

In all honesty, I hope this tragic even can bring us together and closer as a nation and as a state. I think if you can get that flag removed and put away in a museum and that can remove a symbol of oppression to our population here in South Carolina then we will be making great strides towards the harmony that I thought already existed. Racism is real. As much as I don't want to admit it, it is still alive in South Carolina and the only thing I can do about is try to teach my children and future generations that we assess people by their actions or inactions, not by the color of their skin. My 15 year old daughter tearfully told me last night that the pastor of the church said that he forgave the shooter and asked God to have mercy on his soul. If the black community of that church can be so humbled to pray for a person that has killed their family members, then I say the very least that we can do as a white community to support our fallen brothers and sisters, is to take down the flag that may continue to perpetuate the hatred that caused the shootings.

My family fully supports your intention to remove the confederate flag!

Is the Confederate Battle Flag Racist?

The word "CONFEDERACY" or "CONFEDERATION" is defined as a group of people or entities that have formed an ALLIANCE, COMPACT, CONTRACT, which is essentially an AGREEMENT to abide by the terms and conditions thereof.

After winning their freedom from Great Britain, the 13 former British colonies became independent nation-states. Each had their own laws and moral standards of behavior. Some allowed slavery, some did not. They decided to form a CONFEDERATION that became known as the "UNION," but, they DID NOT give up their prior status as "INDEPENDENT, SOVEREIGN, NATION-STATES. They had ZERO interest in being subject to another totalitarian central government like the one they had just defeated in battle. The former British colonies had functioned as self-governing, sovereign entities for 180 years prior to joining the UNION that we now refer to as the "United States." They didn't try to impose moral or ethical standards on each other then, and they certainly did not intend to sign onto a constitution that would allow other states or a central government to impose its will on them later!

The colonial delegates to the Constitutional Convention at Philadelphia in 1787 drafted a new CONFEDERATION that is also called the U.S. CONSTITUTION. The language of that document ALLOWED both the SLAVE states and the FREE states to be equal members of the UNION. Slavery was a constitutionally protected institution. The CONSTITUTION did not allow the slave states to impose slavery on the Free states, nor did it allow the Free states to invade the South or in any way impose its will on the slave states. The Constitution did NOT appoint LINCOLN and the RADICAL REPUBLICANS as the MORALITY POLICE.

Bottom line, Lincoln violated the U. S. Constitution. He BREACHED the COMPACT, the CONTRACT, i.e. the AGREEMENT. He had no constitutional authority to persecute or invade the South. Ft. Sumter was a pretext that Lincoln himself later admitted was used to justify his false claim that the Southern states were in a state of "rebellion." Furthermore, SLAVERY was supported by Lincoln and many Northerners, who still practiced it themselves, or at least did not think of the blacks as equals. In his Inaugural address and later when he was in office, Lincoln endorsed the CORWIN AMENDMENT, which would have made the federal government's protection of slavery explicit and permanent. After the CONFEDERATE STATES OF AMERICA were formed, he told President Jefferson Davis, "Keep your slaves, but come back into the Union."

SLAVERY was NOT the cause of the War of Northern Aggression against the South. Liberals, and especially Democrats have lied about it so long that the public is suffering from a case of maximum IGNORANCE. The only thing that Lincoln did was to convert physical slavery into political repression, which continues to this day. He inflicted a mortal wound to the Constitution, and placed the Executive branch in charge of the Legislative and Judicial branches. He became another "King of England" who reduced the states into little districts over which he became their RULER. Lincoln was a tyrant who accomplished a "coup" that converted a "bottom-up" system of government into a "top-down" dictatorial re-distribution of wealth tyranny. After the Lincoln Radical Republicans left office, and the KKK-led Democrats took over the Congress, they have taught the black man that government is their god. To this day, the black churches are taught by their own pastors to depend on Government instead of God, so they have simply chosen to go to work on Uncle Sam's Plantation. Most blacks are so brain-washed and unteachable that they can't understand why Dr. Martin Luther King was a Republican, and that he KNEW the game that the Democrats were playing on the hearts and minds of his black brethren.
