Ms. Templeton, Ms. Dieck:

I just finally got off the phone with Stericycle. Our contact that was on the call yesterday is very busy traveling and was in a cab as we talked.

They are interested in a relationship with the state to transport Ebola waste but will need to get their government contracting folks involved and this may take a little while. However, we have a draft emergency contract with AEO almost ready to go now.

Important News: Stericycle said the Army is intending to bring their personnel who are fighting Ebola in West Africa back into the US through South Carolina. I'm not sure of the details yet or the implications, but wanted to let you know first thing... She said the Army has a medical incinerator at Ft. Detrick that they may be able to use to dispose of Ebola waste.
