The Budget Commission met in the Governor's Office at 4:30 P. M. on September 5, 1944. All members of the Commission were present.

The following 1944-45 appropriation transfers were approved by the Commission:

Adjutant General

From Item 2 S C Defense Force (Maintenance) - \$320.00 - To Salaries  
Asst. Property & Disbursing Officer

State Treasurer

From Salaries - Coupon Clerk \$600.00 - To Extra Clerical Help.

The Commission allotted \$400.00 from 1944-45 Civil Contingent Fund to the Department of Education to cover the compensation of Director of Public School Music.

The Commission executed a warrant on the Contingent Fund for National Defense for \$10,000.00, as a loan to the Unemployment Compensation Commission in connection with the administration of the Federal Act on unemployment of returning War Veterans.


The Commission approved, with reservation, a revised schedule of salaries submitted by the Insurance Commissioner, the reservation being in connection with the employment of two members of the House of Representatives as inspectors.

The Commission then adjourned.
