Many of South Carolina's congressmen pride themselves on their social media skills. Last week, they were rewarded for their tweeting habits with **Twitter** shout-outs from the visiting prime minister of **India**.

Narendra Modi was on Capitol Hill to deliver a special address to a joint session of Congress, an honor bestowed to foreign leaders.

Mr. WILSON of South Carolina. Mr. Speaker, on Wednesday, I was grateful to serve on the escort committee for Prime Minister Narendra Modi of India, due to my former co-chairmanship of the Caucus on India and Indian Americans, with my father having served in India during World War II.
