SUBJECT: Providing jurisdictional survey responses to Federal government, National Governors Association and National Conference of State Legislators

AAMVA has conducted several jurisdictional surveys in 2005 related to AAMVA's DL/ID Security Framework and the REAL ID Act.

- *February-March 2005* Implementation of AAMVA DL/ID Security Framework
- *July 2005* Jurisdiction Impact Analysis REAL ID Act
- *July 2005* SAVE Survey

AAMVA has received requests from both the federal government (U.S. DHS and U.S. DOT) as well as from the NGA and the NCSL to provide them with all available jurisdictional information on AAMVA's DL/ID Security Framework and the REAL ID Act.

AAMVA has been providing non jurisdiction specific information to these entities since the beginning of 2005. AAMVA has always been careful not to provide member specific information. However, as all entities are now working on developing ideas on what should be part of the rules of the REAL ID Act the need for more specific information has become apparent. AAMVA is working closely with all parties involved to serve its membership. The knowledge gathered through these surveys by AAMVA has put it in a position where it can positively influence the process by which the rules will be developed.

As a result of this request and to continue our good working relationship with these organizations AAMVA will provide the DHS, DOT, NGA and NCSL with information gathered from the aforementioned surveys. AAMVA will also make this information available to its members.

Several members have expressed concern about the possibly sensitive nature of some of the jurisdictional information. We urge anyone receiving this information to not provide it to any other parties (e.g. vendors, media, public).
