Dear Governor Haley:

On October 28, 2015, the Secretary of Agriculture declared 29 South Carolina counties as primary disaster areas due to damages and losses caused by excessive rain and flooding that occurred from October 1, 2015, and continuing. As a result of this declaration, eligible family farmers may qualify for Farm Service Agency (FSA) emergency (EM) loan assistance. Those counties are:


In accordance with Section 321(a) of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act, 13 other South Carolina counties were named as contiguous counties where eligible family farmers may qualify for FSA EM loan assistance. Those counties are:

EM loan assistance is available to any applicant with a qualifying loss in the above counties through June 28, 2016.
