John Arlotta is a 1971 graduate of Notre Dame with a BS in Marketing and a minor in Transportation Management. He was also an Army ROTC graduate, and is a retired Captain in the U.S. Army Reserves. John and his wife Bobbie currently reside in Denver, Colorado. He has 3 adult children, Mindy, Andy, and Jon, and he also has two young grandchildren, Devin and Riley.

Upon graduation from Notre Dame, John has spent 40 years in the healthcare industry. He has managed very large companies as well as small companies, and he has both public and private company CEO experience. His general management experience includes turnarounds and start-ups. He has also completed an Initial Public Offering as well as guided a company through an 18 month hostile takeover. He has sold two healthcare companies and currently works as an advisor for healthcare product and service companies. On July 1st, 2008, he entered the sports management business by purchasing the Minnesota Swarm professional indoor lacrosse franchise, and he is now a Governor and Chairman of the Board of Governors of the National Lacrosse League (NLL). John was named NLL Executive of the Year for 2009 and NLL General Manager of the Year in 2012. He is an active alumnus of the University of Notre Dame where he is a member of the Undergraduate Experience Advisory Council, and he was the lead donor for Arlotta Stadium, which is the new lacrosse only stadium at Notre Dame.

Mr. Arlotta was most recently a Special Healthcare Advisor for General Atlantic, a global Private Equity Fund managing \$15 billion in assets. In his Special Advisor role he assisted GA in identifying health care investment opportunities, participated in due diligence activities, sat on GA Boards, and assisted management teams as needed. He is currently the Chairman of MedExpress, a recent GA investment in the Urgent Care industry. He is also a Special Advisor to private equity firm MTS Partners where he is Executive Chairman of Novis Pharmaceuticals, a distributor of blood plasma and pharmaceutical products located in Miami, Florida. Prior to his current roles, Mr. Arlotta served as Chairman, President and CEO of Denver based Coram Inc, a privately held provider of home infusion and specialty pharmacy services with \$500 million in revenues. The company merged with Apria Healthcare in December 2008. Prior to Coram, he served as Chairman and CEO of NeighborCare Inc., a Baltimore based public company (NASDAQ:NCRX) with annual revenues of \$1.6 billion. NeighborCare was in the business of providing pharmaceutical products and services to nursing homes. John joined NeighborCare in July, 2003 and took the company public in December of that year.

Shortly after going public, NeighborCare became the target of a hostile takeover attempt by its largest competitor, and the company was ultimately sold in July of 2005. Prior to NeighborCare,

from 1995 to 2000, John was the President and Chief Operating Officer of Caremark Rx as well as the President of Caremark's specialty biotech drug distribution business. Caremark was a publicly traded (NYSE:CMX) Pharmacy Benefit Management (PBM) company with revenues that grew from \$1 billion to \$6 billion during John's tenure. From 1986 to 1996, John was the Chairman, President, and CEO of HealthCall Corporation, a Milwaukee based distributor of durable medical equipment and consumable medical supplies for home health care. John started his health care career in 1971 at Chicago based Baxter International. In his 15 years at Baxter, he held a variety of sales, marketing, and general management positions. While at Baxter, he started one of the country's first home care companies, providing IV therapy to chronically ill patients. He is a recipient of the prestigious Baxter Distinguished Salesman Club Award, and a past member of the Young Presidents Organization.

CareCore National was founded as Hudson Imaging Network (HIN) in Poughkeepsie, New York in 1994 with the purpose of delivering quality-focused Radiology Benefit Management (RBM) programs to ensure the availability of medically appropriate, cost-effective diagnostic imaging.

In 2002, the company name changed to CareCore National and opened a third Operations Center in Hardeeville, South Carolina, adding to the Colorado and New York Operations Centers already in place. The South Carolina Operations Center housed 249 employees including physician and clinical review staff, non-clinical Intake and customer service staff, Human Resources and IT Staff. In 2004, Legal and Account Management staff was added.

Building on its success in radiology management, and with a fully scalable IT infrastructure in place, CareCore launched a cardiology solution in 2006. The cardiology solution effectively manages cardiac imaging and implantable devices targeting inappropriate utilization. The program assures that services are performed at sites meeting national accreditation standards. In 2007, CareCore National introduced a comprehensive medical oncology program that identified market-based acquisition costs of injectable and oncology drugs combined with evidence-based criteria to guide and incentivize the appropriate use of oncology drugs and adjunctive agents. The criteria were integrated into prior authorization programs, one of which was specifically designed for the management of erythropoietin stimulating agents (ESAs). CareCore's oncology solutions included a full range of services including Fair Market Value™ (FMV™) fee reimbursement methodology, unclassified injectable drug tracking, and high-cost injectable drug management. In 2008, CareCore National introduced a first-in-marketplace radiation therapy solution that is centered on an evaluation of the radiation treatment plan for each treated member prior to the beginning of the member's treatment. Also, in 2008, CareCore introduced a therapy and therapeutic site-oriented sleep-disordered breathing solution targeted at managing the growing demand for sleep services. The sleep solution addresses a wide range of procedures from the initial diagnosis to the ongoing monitoring of patient compliance with sleep therapy and the quality of care being delivered to sleep patients while reducing costs associated with sleep disordered breathing.

In 2009, musculoskeletal and lab solutions were introduced. The musculoskeletal solution supports proper use of conservative and interventional musculoskeletal and pain care in the context of a longitudinal musculoskeletal and pain management plan. The lab solution was co-developed with the University Of Washington Department Of Laboratory Medicine.

In January 2011, CareCore National launched PathForward Oncology program, a cancer care pathways. The pathways are evidence-based clinical algorithms that standardize best practices for chemotherapy-based treatment and related services.

In 2012, CareCore launched ACO solutions geared at helping ACOs manage quality and utilization through decision support tools. Also in 2012, CareCore expanded its Network Quality Assessment solution ensuring only quality providers provide managed healthcare services. Additionally, a HEDIS Compliance Reporting Solution was started in 2012.

CareCore National provides evidence-based healthcare solutions that improve quality of care. With solutions that address a wide array of healthcare services including radiology, cardiology, medical oncology, radiation oncology, sleep apnea, musculoskeletal care and lab testing services, CareCore National touches the lives of over 55 million individually insured lives across commercial, Medicare

Advantage and managed Medicaid health plans, accountable care organizations and self-insured employers. All solutions utilize the most advanced and innovative technologies in healthcare supported by partnerships with Cisco, VMWare, EMC² and GemFire combined with clinical expertise from academic and community physicians from across the country. CareCore National is a URAC accredited and NCQA certified utilization review organization.
