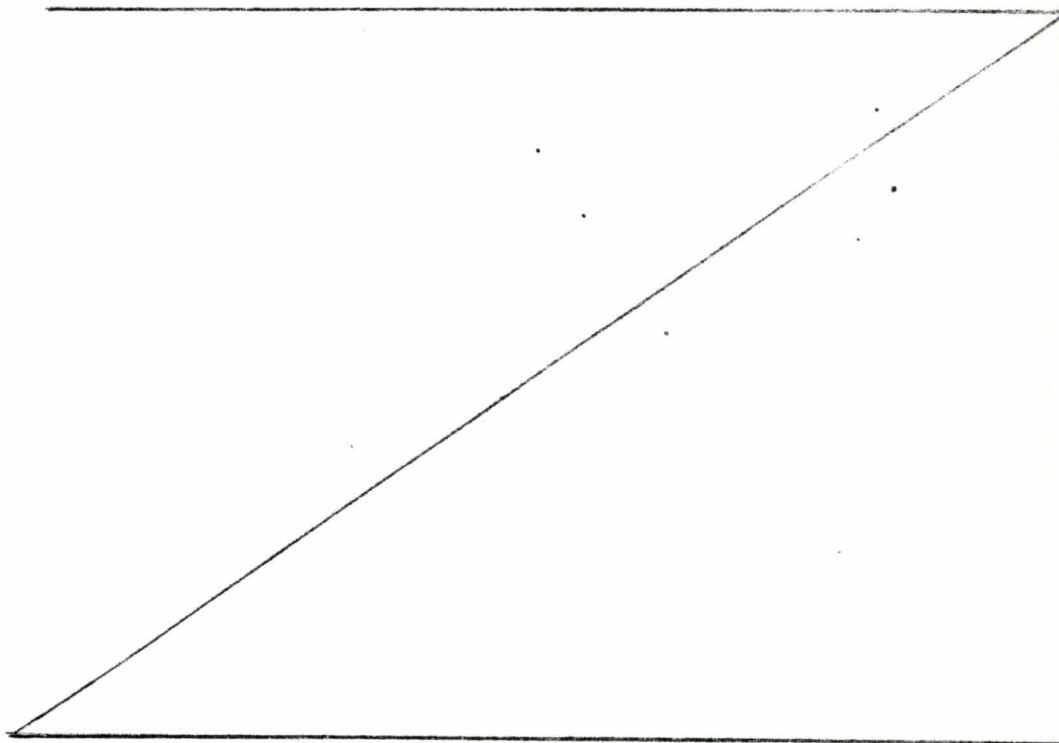

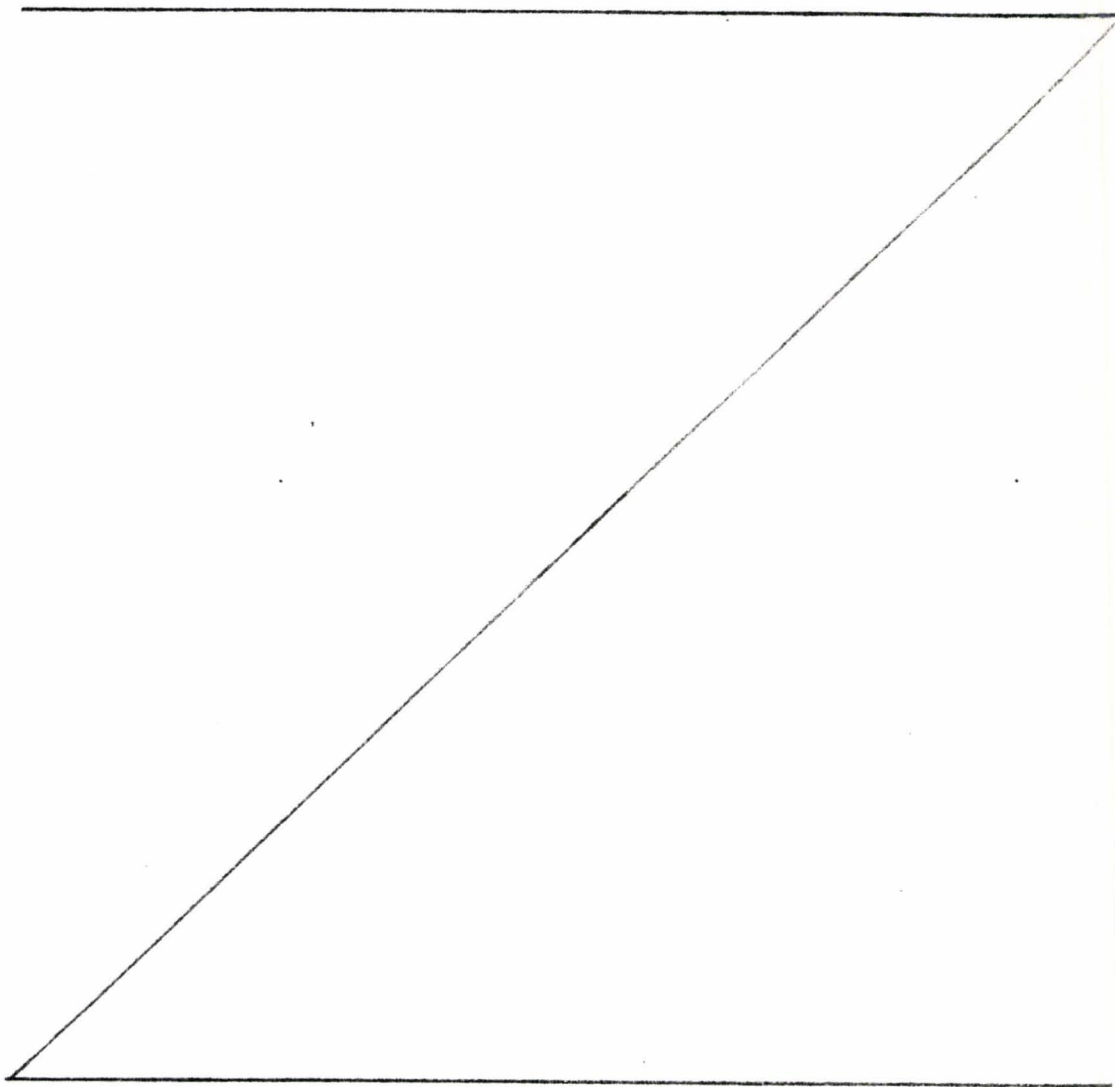

RECOMMENDATIONS

Highways and Public Transportation Commission Meeting of November 17, 1988

Monthly reports published by the Department of activities for the month of October, 1988 are submitted under separate cover. These reports are for the information of the Commission.

It is recommended that the Commission accept the October, 1988 reports.

SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT NUMBER 4 HOWARD NEEDLES TAMMEN & BERGENDOFF

Pursuant to previous Commission approvals to proceed with development of the Socastee Bridge Project in Horry County, the Department further requests Commission approval to enter into supplemental agreement Number 4 with Howard Needles Tammen & Bergendoff to provide professional engineering services relative to the widening of S. C. 544 from the proposed new Socastee Bridge to U. S. 17 Bypass in Horry County.

This supplemental agreement Number 4 would provide preliminary and final design plans for the widening of S. C. 544 extending approximately 8500 feet from about 1100 feet southeast of its intersection with S-375 to about 1200 feet northwest of the U. S. 17 Bypass interchange.

The estimated cost of this phase of work would not exceed \$144,600.00.

AGREEMENT FOR CONSULTANT SERVICES

The Department requests Commission approval to enter into an agreement with Baker Engineers to provide engineering services for upgrading a section of I-85 in Cherokee County from a point northeast of S. C. Route 105 to a point southwest of S. C. Route 5.

These improvements would include necessary modifications to the existing substandard interchanges and bridges at S. C. Route 18/Road S-82, S. C. Route 11, and S. C. Route 18/S. C. Route 329.

The estimated cost for the initial phase of work (Section I-Feasibility Studies) would not exceed \$404,200.00.

Recommendations - 11/17/88

Agreement with Clemson University for continuation of the
Transportation Technology Transfer Service (T³S).

The Department intends to enter into an agreement with Clemson University for continuation of the Transportation Technology Transfer Service (T³S) for calendar year 1989. The Technology Transfer Program was initiated by the FHWA to share technology with and provide assistance to local transportation agencies. The T³ Service in Clemson has provided information to cities, counties, and the Department on transportation matters through workshops, a telephone service, quarterly newsletters, and by providing video tapes on various transportation topics on a loan basis upon request.

The cost of the Service for next year is \$159,750. The FHWA will provide 50% of the funding through the Rural Technical Assistance Program (RTAP). The remaining portion will be funded by the Department through Training Funds in accordance with FHWA guidelines.

The FHWA promotes the continuation of the T³ Service and it is recommended that the Commission give approval for the Department to enter into this Agreement.

Recommendations - 11/17/88

Agreement with Pulse Radar, Inc., for determination of voids
under concrete pavement on I-85 in Anderson County.

The Department intends to enter into an agreement with Pulse Radar, Inc., for their services in determining the location and size of voids under the existing jointed concrete pavement on I-85 in Anderson County. This information is needed for a rehabilitation contract to be let next year on this section of I-85. The radar detection method used by Pulse Radar, Inc., was tried by the Department in 1985 on a section of I-95 in Darlington and Florence Counties with good results. Deflection measurements, normally used by the Department in the past to detect voids, did not prove to be very accurate compared to results obtained with radar on I-95. Also, a recent FHWA sponsored study evaluated several methods of determining the location of voids under pavements and sited the radar method as one of the most reliable of existing methods.

An agreement will be negotiated for an estimated amount of \$12,000.00. Preliminary Engineering funds will be used to cover the cost of the work. The cost includes interpretation of the data and providing profiles of the voids.

AGREEMENT WITH BURTON AND ASSOCIATES

At the October 15, 1987 meeting of the Commission, the Department was given authorization for the expenditure of 100% federal (UMTA) public transportation funds (\$50,000) to engage the professional services of a qualified consultant to develop/update multi-year financial plans for S.C.'s transit operators.

Upon the Commission's approval, a bid solicitation, review, and selection process was conducted through General Services, Materials Management Office. The Materials Management Office has concluded that Burton and Associates submitted the most responsive proposal and bid.

It is recommended that the Commission authorize the Department to enter into an agreement with Burton and Associates to develop multi-year financial plans for S.C.'s transit operators for a total contract maximum of \$49,903.

Recommendation 11/17/88

Agreement With The Urban Mass Transportation Administration

The Department requests Commission approval to enter into an agreement with the U.S. Department of Transportation, Urban Mass Transportation Administration, to administer Section 3 funds which have been authorized to the Department for public transportation.

This project will provide Section 3 funds to the Department on behalf of nine rural transit properties. The scope of this project is as follows: 1) the purchase of 74 revenue vehicles, including buses, trolley buses and vans, some of which will be lift-equipped; 2) spare components; 3) seven operations and/or maintenance facilities, including such things as engineering, real estate/land acquisition, and construction or renovations; 4) the purchase of two service vehicles; 5) the purchase of bus shelters, benches and bus stop signs; 6) the purchase of wheelchair lifts; and 7) the purchase of communications equipment, office equipment, computer equipment and shop tools and equipment.

Agreement With The Urban Mass Transportation Administration

At the request of the Urban Mass Transportation Administration (UMTA), and the concurrence of South Carolina State College, the Department has filed an application on behalf of South Carolina State College under UMTA's Entrepreneurial Services Challenge Grant Program.

This project will provide UMTA Section 3 funds to the Department to support a two-year privatization demonstration project that will be conducted under the auspices of South Carolina State College and use of a private bus company to establish and operate public transportation service in the Orangeburg area. The scope of this project is as follows: 1) The lease of five (5) revenue vehicles, including buses and one wheelchair equipped van; and 2) the purchase of a passenger shelter and a bus stop sign.

HIGHWAYS AND PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

PROGRAM TITLE: Agency Budget

MISSION STATEMENT:

The Department of Highways and Public Transportation is responsible for the systematic planning, construction, maintenance and operation of the state highway system, the regulation of traffic thereon, the administration and enforcement of traffic, driver and motor vehicle laws, the coordinating of all state and federal programs relating to public transportation and the performance of other duties and matters as may be delegated to it by law.

The Department is governed by a 20 member commission - sixteen elected by legislative delegations from the state's judicial circuits, two appointed by the governor and two are committee chmn. from the General Assembly. The commission meets monthly.

The day-to-day affairs of the Department are conducted by three officials; executive director, state highway engineer and secretary-treasurer, who are elected by the commission. The executive director's term of office is four years, while the state highway engineer and secretary-treasurer serve at the pleasure of the commission.

As provided by state law, the Department consists of four major divisions - engineering, motor vehicle, law enforcement and public transportation. There are several smaller divisions which provide support services such as finance and control and administration.

For administering its statewide programs, the Department has divided the state into seven highway districts. Engineering, law enforcement and motor vehicle/driver services are largely administered from the district level. A district engineering administrator supervises construction and maintenance activities, a district captain commands law enforcement personnel and a district manager is responsible for vehicle and driver services.

As of 6/30/88, the Department had 7,172 employees, including the 3 officers, 1,412 administrative and clerical, 1,343 engineering, 1,271 law enforcement, public safety and licensing and 3,143 crafts and trades employees.

South Carolina, at 40,662 miles, is ranked 5th in the nation in miles of state highways after North Carolina, 77,226; Texas, 71,778; Virginia, 55,110; and, Pennsylvania, 46,202.

STATUTORY HISTORY:

The Department was established in 1917 by the General Assembly and operates pursuant to Title 57 of the 1976 S. C. Code of Laws, as amended.

The following recommendations are being made in order to enhance the effectiveness of purchasing, preparation and delivery of equipment.

1. Trucks and bodies to be purchased as separate units; however, installation of bodies will be the responsibility of the District Mechanical Engineers.
2. Where practical and with agreement between Director, Supply & Equipment and District Mechanical Engineer(s) purchase equipment as a complete unit.
3. Field repair shops be limited as much as possible the sending of equipment (including patrol and other sedans) to the Equipment Service Depot for repairs. Any equipment/vehicles assigned to district personnel (Engineering, Patrol and Motor Vehicle) that must be sent to the Equipment Service Depot be requested through the Equipment Service Depot Superintendent by the respective District Mechanical Engineer. This would provide additional man-hours for equipment/vehicle preparation and delivery.
4. In cases of emergencies that would require the addition or modification (such as lights, radios, antenna, etc.) to equipment/vehicles be accomplished by contract and/or qualified department personnel at the District level.
5. Insure, when required, that equipment training is provided for operator(s) to include preventative maintenance as determined by both Supply & Equipment Director and District Mechanical Engineer(s). This joint determination will include time and place.
6. Due to the increase of equipment and vehicle units, add one additional radio technician to each district in order to allow more radio repair to be done in the field rather than being shipped to the Central Radio Repair Shop, thereby allowing additional man-hours for installation of radios into equipment/vehicle for delivery.
7. Contract for removal of decals, striping, radio and blue light wiring and for plugging holes and painting of vehicles being turned in for sale. This will provide additional man-hours for vehicle preparation for delivery.
8. Contract, if applicable, for repairs to patrol radar units, and should require vendor to have multi-locations throughout the state and at least ten (10) day turn around service.
9. Through a joint effort by Director of Maintenance, Director of Supply & Equipment and District Mechanical Engineers establish some standardization of maintenance equipment, thereby reducing the number of specifications to be written and purchase orders issued.
10. When appropriate and economically justified, request of the State Procurement Division that SCDHPT have the option of extending yearly equipment purchasing contracts which could eliminate some specifications preparation and time required for receiving bids. Such request should be a joint agreement by Director of Maintenance, Director of Supply & Equipment and Director of Administration.
11. That appropriate radio repair facilities be provided in each of the seven (7) districts. This could be accomplished by providing adequate space in existing buildings or through modifications to existing buildings.

Schedule For Handling Maintenance Equipment Requests

Authorization letter from the State Highway Engineer to District Engineering Administrators showing estimated budget amount available for equipment be sent by December 1. Equipment requests from the districts forwarded to the Director of Maintenance Office by January 15. The districts should also send a copy of their lists to the Director of Supply and Equipment. The Director of Maintenance should then review the district's request, compile a summary, and send the summary to the Director of Supply & Equipment by February 28.

Following review of equipment requests by the Director of Supply & Equipment schedule a meeting, no later than March 10, with District Mechanical Engineers, Director of Maintenance and Director of Administration for a final review. Requisitions should be forwarded to State Highway Engineer and Executive Director for their review and approval by March 31. After final approval by Executive Director, the Director of Supply & Equipment should complete, with minimal exceptions, specifications and forward for purchasing by August 31. (Every effort should be made to follow this schedule beginning with the current fiscal year 88-89).

Compliance Responsibility

Coordination of the above recommendations will be the responsibility of the Director of Administration. Any recommendations for deletions, additions or revisions will be made by the Director of Administration through appropriate authority to the Commission.
