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An allotment of \$775.00 was made from the Civil Contingent Fund to the Superintendent of Education's Office to cover the expense of a survey in connection with the adoption of a twelfth grade program in the high schools in the State.

The Secretary reported balances of \$28,632.68 in the Civil Contingent Fund, and \$58,010.10 in the Contingent Fund for National Defense exclusive of allotments made at this meeting.
