In her letter she said, "Just as we should not relinquish control of education to the Federal government, neither should we cede it to the consensus of other states."

Last year, the governor proudly signed H.3893 into law, a bill that abandoned a nationalized standard and retuned control of our children's education standards back to the people of South Carolina. Thanks to H.3893 the responsibility for setting education standards in our state and a path forward for South Carolina students now is in the hands of the State Board of Education and the Education Oversight Committee.
