Dear Spartanburg Officials:

I hope you all saw the article in the paper today, that the Herald Journal was kind enough to publish. I will be happy to answer all questions that I can. Since the President of World Relief makes over \$300,000 per year and the organization, along with the other 8 large contractors, receive over one billion dollars a year, they are highly motivated to bring refugees here. I understand that each refugee settled is worth \$10,000 to the contractor. This is big business and I have yet to hear of a community where ordinary citizens believe the transformations wrought by World Relief and its allies were for the benefit of the ordinary citizens, white and black.

I know Alexia disagrees, and I love Alexia and the work she does in saving babies, but those babies are our children and fall within the purview of our responsibility, but taking on the world is not our responsibility and furthermore, our dollars will go further in the Middle East than in Spartanburg. Middle East refugees should be cared for in the Middle East.

I wonder if Alexia is affiliated with one of the groups bringing in the Refugees - that could affect where she stands on this issue. Otherwise, I do not see how it will enhance her ministry to stress our social safety nets

further than they are already stretched.

Dear Spartanburg Officials,

Jane has raised the question of sources. This is an important question. I am assuming you are in a better position to get information than I am, but not one single official has given me any information. Lisa Benson, who some of you heard speak at the PHRW July 4th celebration originally sent the article about the refugees coming here.

I have no firsthand information, but here is what I learned today: 1) Alexia Newman says this has been in the works for a year; 2) Dr. Lyle Rapacki, who is based in AZ and studies security issues, says the donor countries are sending the criminals and uneducated who are the least desirable immigrants; and Michael Cutler, retired INS agent with 30 years experience and who appears regularly on Fox News, told me this information is consistent with what he knows about the U N resettlement program. Like Benson and Rapacki, he says, we can stop this if our leaders are determined, but once here, there will be nothing we can do. Athens, Ga. is being suggested as a model for us but I am still researching, and looking for other communities that have gotten ahead of this kind of tyrannical imposition by the United Nations. I hope I am not the only person interested in this problem, or at least in finding out for sure if there is a problem.
